CITY OF SEBREE, KENTUCKY **ORDINANCE No. 2024-002** 

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF SEBREE RELATED TO WATER AND SEWER CONNECTION FEES

AND RECONNECTION FEES BE IT ORDAINED By THE CITY COUNCIL OF SEBREE, KENTUCKY:

That the Sebree Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

A. Water Connection Fees

The connection fees for water service shall be as follows:

1.3/4" connection and 50 feet or less 2.1" connection and 50 feet or less

3. Above 1" connection

4. Connections over 50" 5. Boring under streets/roads

\$1,500.00

\$2.000.00 plus \$500.00 for each 1/4" above 1"

Connection fee plus \$30.00 per foot over 50 feet

Customer shall pay any costs

associated.

**B. Sewer Connection Fees** 

The connection or tap fees for sanitary service shall be as follows: 1. Connections 50 feet or less

2. Connections over 50 feet

\$1,200.00 plus \$24.00 per foot over 50 feet

3 Boring under streets/roads

Customer shall pay any costs associated

C. Water Reconnection Fees

Chapter XV, Article II, Section 3 shall be amended as follows: Section 3. In addition to the penalty provided in Section 2, the City shall have the right to discontinue water service to any property where any water bill remains unpaid after the fifteenth (15th) day of the month in which the bill is due. The service shall not be reconnected until such time as the past due water bill and all penalties and reconnection fees then due and owing are paid. The reconnection fee is twenty-five (\$25.00) fifty, (\$50.00) and the reconnection fee becomes due at that date and time that a city employee leaves the offices of the City of Sebree with a shutoff list in his or her possession to shut off the water for customers whose property water bills remain unpaid for more than 15 days. Reconnections shall be made by the end of the business day following the payment of all past due amounts, penalties, and recon-

D. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption and the publication in accordance with Kentucky Law.

E. Any ordinance and any portion of any ordinance in conflict herewith is hereby repealed

READING/ADOPTION

The foregoing ordinance was read and presented for its first reading at the meeting of the Sebree City Council conducted on February 20, 2024 and for its second reading at the meeting of the Sebree City Council conducted on March 18, 2024.

Upon the motion of Council Member Megan Brown and seconded by Council Member to adopt the ordinance, the City Council voted as follows

WHEREUPON, it appearing that six Council Members voted AYE on the motion and zero council members voted NO on the motion, the Mayor announced that the motion PASSED/FAILED, and, if PASSED, that the above stated ordinance would be submitted for his signature and then published as required by law, to be effective immediately upon the completion thereof.
