#### Center was taken into custody and charged with Sexual Abuse, Second Degree.

After receiving information suggesting a possible inappropriate relationship between a PCDC Corrections Officer and an inmate, Immediately, a full internal investigation was launched with cooperation from the Stanton Police

Department and Commonwealth Attorney's Office of the 39th Judicial District. In the course of this investigation, sufficient evidence became apparent to charge the officer, who was charged by the Stanton Police Department and taken into custody by Jailer Lacy, then transported to the Clark County Detention Center.

While no further comment is available at this time due to the ongoing nature of this investigation, Jailer Lacy has released the following statement, "I want it to be known that the public doesn't have to worry about placing their trust in this institution. Our facility takes our responsibility to the law, the State of Kentucky and the citizens of Powell County very seriously both inside and outside of our walls. If one of my deputies does something like this, I will put the cuffs on them personally, and transport them to another facility."

To qualify for the Specailty Program, individuals must have a felony conviction. In this program participants are expected to actively progress according to their personalized program plan. .These plans set forth goals such as securing employment, earning a GED, and reuniting with family, and frequuent urine screenings, which may occur up to twicea week. The program takes 18 monthes. If not for the dedication of people like Judge Lisa Whisman and Christina Ware, many would struggle to find their way. They truly are lights in people's windows, offering hope and guidance, In coversations with them, I am reminded of the phrase. "We'll leave the light on for you" symbolizing their unwavering support and commitment.

Some skeptics have other thoughts about the Northern Lights. An Alaskan research facility and program known as the High-frequency Active Auroral Research Program (HAARP) had a research experiment scheduled for May 8th through May 10th. The program was initiated by the U.S. Military in 1991, but has been under the direction of the University of Alaska since 2015. The facility has confirmed that it has the capability of producing artificial auroras by supercharging particles in Earth's Ionosphere, and admits that it has produced auroras in the past that were visible from 300 miles away or less, but assure this latest phenomenon was not related to the experiment. Southern Florida is 4,000 miles or more from the HAARP facility at Gakona, Alaska.

Whatever the source, the Aurora Borealis was visible as far south as Southern Florida, which is extremely rare. If you were fortunate enough to see it, it was quite the spectacle, and a sight that many may never experience again.
