ORDINANCE NO. 220.195 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE LEVYING AND COLLECTION OF AN AD VALOREM TAX FOR THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, KENTUCKY FOR THE YEAR OF 2025

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, KENTUCKY:

SECTION I: An ad valorem tax of .186 on each \$100.00 worth of property is hereby levied on all lands, improvements and personal property, tangible and intangible, held or owned by any person, firm, company, corporation or association in his, her, theirs, or its name, or as fiduciary or agent and subject to taxation under the laws of the State of Kentucky, including all property and franchises heretofore and hereinafter assessed by the Adair County Property Valuation Administrator, State Tax Commission and the State Board of Valuation and Assessment.

SECTION II: All such taxes above shall be paid to the City Clerk/Treasurer and shall be due and collectible on September 15, 2025 and all taxpayers whose taxes are not paid on or before January 2, 2026, shall be deemed delinquent, and shall pay in addition to the amount of taxes due, a penalty of ten (10%) percent and said penalty shall be collected in the same manner as the taxes due. All taxes paid on or before November 03, 2025 shall be entitled to a discount of two (2%) percent.

SECTION III: The City Clerk/Treasurer is hereby authorized to collect said taxes and penalties and to allow proper discount.

SECTION IV: This ad valorem tax is levied for the purpose of paying officers and employees of the City of Columbia, expenses of the Fire Department, street maintenance and improvements, construction as well as the current expenses of the city and shall be paid into the Main Account for the purpose of paying all legal claims arising against the city.

SECTION V: Any unpaid tax as herein provided for shall remain a lien against the property in favor of the City of Columbia until paid.

SECTION VI: This ordinance becomes effective upon adoption and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE NO. 120.12

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 120.11
OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, KENTUCKY
FIXING THE TIME OF THE REGULAR COUNCIL MEETINGS,
AND THE REGULAR MEETING PLACE OF THE
CITY COUNCIL OF SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Columbia, Kentucky passed an ordinance on March 01, 2004 fixing the time of the Regular Meetings and the regular meeting place of the City Council of said city;

WHEREAS, Section 86.070 if the Kentucky Revised Statutes provides that the City Council of a City of the Fourth Class shall hold Regular Meetings once each month at a time fixed by ordinance and that all meetings of said City Council shall be held within the city limits at a place designated by ordinance and shall be public, and;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Columbia, Kentucky, which is a Fourth-Class city, desires to clarify its records and to publish an ordinance amending the time of its Regular Meeting; and retain the regular meeting place of its meetings.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, KENTUCKY, DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. The City Council of the City shall hold a Regular Meeting once a month on the first Monday of each month at ~~7:00 P.M. 6:00 P.M.~~ 5:00 P.M., based on the official time then prevailing throughout Adair County, Kentucky, provided however, that whenever the first Monday of a month falls on a legal holiday, then the Regular Meeting for that month shall be held on the ensuing Tuesday which is a secular day at ~~7:00 P.M. 6:00 P.M.~~ 5:00 P.M or if such Tuesday is also a holiday, then on the ensuing Wednesday.

Section 2. The Regular Meeting place at which said City Council shall hold its meetings shall be at the City Hall in said city.

Section 3. Special meetings of said City Council may be called at any time by the Mayor or by four members of the City Council, by written notice delivered at 24 hours prior to the time specified for the proposed meeting, to each member, to the Mayor, to each local newspaper of general circulation, each news service and each local radio or television station which as on file

with the City Council written request to be notified of Special Meetings of said City Council, in accordance with KRS 61.805-991.

Section 4. All motions, ordinances, resolutions, and parts thereof in conflict herewith are repealed, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its enactment, approval and publication as provided by law.

Round Trip, LLC, is proposing to construct and operate a solar and battery energy project in Russell and Adair Counties, Kentucky. The proposed project called the Russell County Solar Park will be located on approximately 450 acres in the vicinity of Old Sano Rd and Bottoms Rd, South of Sano Rd, approximately 5 miles northwest of Russell Springs, where less than 50 acres are in Adair County. A public meeting to inform the community about the project will take place on Friday, September 19th, 2025 at 4:00PM Central (5:00PM EDT) at the Holloway Health and Wellness Center at 399 Williams St, Columbia KY 42728 in the Multi-Purpose Room. The meeting is expected to last around 1 hour.

Members of the public are strongly encouraged to attend and participate. If any member of the community wishes to attend virtually, or propose a direct question, please email info@roundtripenergy.com or call (202)-787-8453 at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting to request access to the virtual meeting. The proposed photovoltaic solar project will consist of solar panels installed on racks with an approximate maximum height of 15 feet, inverters, transformers, an energy storage system, associated wiring and balance of system, and a substation. The power generated by the project will be linked to the electric transmission grid via direct connection an existing EKPC transmission substation on or near the property. The project will install a visual vegetative buffer along portions of the perimeter of the project two staggered rows of native, evergreen plantings.
