On Tuesday, February 25, 2025, Fleming County Deputy Sheriff, Sgt. Logan Mullins, responded to a complaint on Goddard Road, where he arrested Bruce 'Bruce-Bruce' Toy.

Toy was charged with Trafficking in a Controlled Substance Methamphetamine; and possession of paraphernalia.

On Thursday, February 27, 2025, Deputy Sheriff, Welch, K9 Rex, and Flemingsburg Police Officer, Tayler Moore, were at a residence on Dorothy Street in Flemingsburg, to serve an active warrant for Jason Bishop. During the investigation, Deputy Welch located 21 grams of methamphetamine. Bishop was arrested and charged with multiple drug-related offenses.

On Friday, February 28, 2025, Sheriff Tim Smith, assisted by Chief Deputy, Rob Conn, and Kentucky State Police Trooper Tyler Smith, responded to a call on South Lick Road, near Hillsboro, and arrested Eddie Wallace, 43.

During the investigation, officers located 81 grams of methamphetamine in Wallace's possession. Wallace was charged with Trafficking in a Controlled Substance Methamphetamine and Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon. Additionally, Trooper Tyler Smith served a probation warrant on Wallace for Manslaughter (charge from another county).

The Fleming County Sheriff's Office 'remains committed to combating drug activity within the extended Fleming County communities'. Sheriff Tim Smith stated. "These investigations demonstrate our continued efforts to keep dangerous drugs off our streets. We encourage residents to report any suspicious activity to help us protect our community."

All persons are to be presumed innocent until proven guilty or pleading guilty.

Anyone with information regarding illegal drug activity is urged to contact the Fleming County Sheriff's Office.

MSUTeach helps to alleviate state's teacher shortage

MSUTeach program is helping provide impactful educators for the region and state. The program offers students the opportunity to complete a Bachelor of Science degree in a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) field of study within four years while earning a teacher certification.

MSUTeach students gained real-world classroom experience in coordination with master teachers Diane Johnson and Mary Beth Armstrong.

One presentation highlighted the work of apprentice teachers Courtnev Bowling and Kristin Thacker, who taught math at Rowan County Senior High School. Noah Smith, another apprentice teacher, taught biology at Montgomery County High School and submitted his presentation but could not attend the showcase due to work commitments

Bowling and Thacker summarized their semester as they became fully responsible fortheir classrooms, built

relationships with students, developed, and implemented multiple instructional units, and completed all the tasks of a regular teacher. Their advice regarding best practices and tips for succeeding in the classroom resonated with participants.

"All three of our graduating apprentice teachers have accepted full-time positions in schools in the MSU service region," Armstrong said. "Their mentor teachers and school principals praised how well prepared they are and the positive impact they are having on student learning."

In addition to Master Teachers Johnson Armstrong, David Long, director of MSUTeach; Dr. Will Tidwell, assistant professor of mathematics; Dr. Michele Cudd, assistant professor of education; and Dr. Wilson González-Espada, professor of physics and science education, supported the program with instruction on STEM content and education skills. Last year, MSUTeach showcased student accomplishto reveal their findings and reflections as class-

room teachers. "Given the shortage of highly qualified science and mathematics teachers in the state, their expertise has been essential in preparing highly sought-after high school educators in Eastern Kentucky," Armstrong said.

The MSUTeach Program, part of the Volgenau College of Education, continually recruits students interested in teaching science and mathematics and making a difference as high school teachers.
