# Look Up! Superman is back in theaters!!!

When it comes to live action portrayals of Superman, the Man of Steel, there is quite a long list.

Such as: the late Kirk Alyn in 1948's Superman 15-part B&W serial, and its sequel serial Atom Man vs. Superman... the late George Reeves in 1952's B&W Adventures of Superman tv show, which lasted six seasons... the late Christopher Reeve in 1978's Superman: The Movie, and its three sequels... Dean Cain in 1993's Lois and Clark: The New Adventures of Superman tv series, which lasted four seasons... Tom Welling in

2001's *Smallville* tv series, which lasted 10 seasons... Brandon Routh in 2006's *Superman Returns* film... Henry Cavill in 2013's *Man of Steel*, and his various appearances in the DCEU (DC Extended Universe) films... and Tyler Hoechlin in 2016's *Superman and Lois* tv series, which lasted four seasons.

And that's not even mentioning the numerous actors who have voiced Superman in a countless number of animated variations, including stand-out Tim Daly, who wonderfully voiced Superman / Clark Kent in 1996's *Superman: The Animated Series* which lasted 4 seasons.

But “Look Up!” there’s

a new Superman, and his name is David Corenswet, and he does an absolutely wonderful job stepping into the red and blue caped outfit as Superman and the simple spectacles and ill-fitting suit when he is Clark Kent, in 2025's simply titled Superman, directed by James Gunn.

The new Superman film is the first theatrical step in the newly rebooted DCU (DC Universe) of films, which will feature films and tv series focusing on DC comics characters, including the current Creature Commandos animated series on HBO Max, which ties into the DCU.

2025's Superman film stars Corenswet as Superman / Clark Kent,

Rachel Brosnahan as Lois Lane, and Nicholas Hoult as supervillain Lex Luthor. All three actors give it their all. Coreswett shines as Superman and also shines when he is playing his secret identity, mild-mannered Daily Planet reporter Clark Kent. Brosnahan makes the character of Lois all her own, with shades of the late Margot Kidder who played Lois Lane in 1978's *Superman: The Movie* seeping through. But Hoult as Lex Luthor almost steals the show from Coreswett's portrayal of Superman. Hoult's Luthor is a straight up supervillain through and through, and his dastardly deeds in trying to take down the Man of Steel down are sometimes straight up evil and played with a menace. You'll have to see it to believe it, when it comes to the things that Lex is capable of.

The new film is absolutely action-packed, almost from start to finish, and is wonderfully directed by James Gunn, who previously brought to life *The Guardians of the Galaxy* trilogy of films from the Marvel Universe.

But all in all, a dog steals the show!!! That's right!!! Krypto the Su-
