Simons Middle School to implement Daily Moment of Silence

From the Simons Middle School Facebook page...

“When students return to Simons Middle School on Monday, August 25th, we will begin implementing a daily Moment of Silence, in accordance with KRS 158.175, a state law that requires all Kentucky public schools to provide this opportunity each day.

This brief, intentional pause will take place at the beginning of the first class period each morn-

ing, offering students a moment to center themselves and prepare for the day ahead.

According to the statute:

1. The moment of silence or reflection shall be at least one minute but not more than two minutes.

2. Students are to remain seated and silent and make no distractions so that each student may meditate, pray or engage in other silent activity which does not interfere

with or distract from, or impede other students' exercise of individual choice. Students who are disruptive during this time are subject to being removed from the class and may face other consequences for disruption of the educational process or for being habitually disruptive.

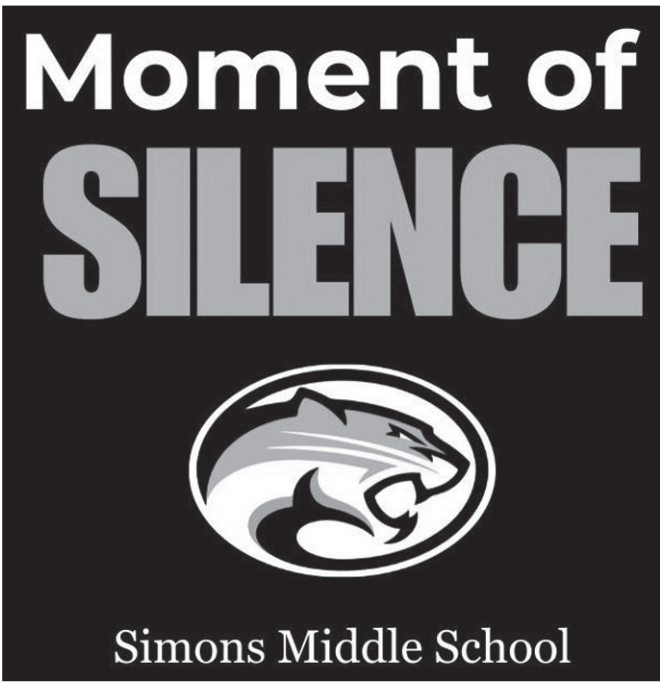
3. School personnel shall not provide instruction to any student regarding the nature of their silent reflection.

We encourage families

to talk with their students about how they might personally use this time, whether to reflect, set intentions, calm their minds, or pray, so that it becomes a meaningful and positive start to each day.

Kentucky State Police Post 8 Traffic Safety Checkpoint Announcement

The Kentucky State Police (KSP), Morehead Post would like to offer periodic reminders to drivers who travel our roadways. Our agency strives daily to ensure the safety of the motoring public. Some of these proactive measures include various roadside safety checkpoints and saturating known problematic areas in the district through general patrol tactics.

The Kentucky State Police utilizes traffic safety checkpoints

to promote safety for motorists using the public roadways and to provide a deterrent for those who violate laws contained in the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

The intent of a traffic safety checkpoint is to provide high visibility, public safety service, focusing on operator impairment, vehicular equipment deficiencies (confirming appropriate registration and insurance of vehicles) and the

valid licensing of drivers. Other violations of law and/or other public safety issues that arise will be addressed.

These checkpoints will allow the Kentucky State Police the opportunity to periodically concentrate its efforts in checking for violations of Kentucky traffic and regulatory laws that will ultimately increase the safety of the citizens within the Commonwealth.

Post 8 serves the following counties: Bath, Elliott, Fleming, Lewis, Mason, Menifee, Montgomery, Morgan, Powell, Rowan and Wolfe.

This sale is to satisfy Judgment in the sum of \$3,236.62, plus interest, taxes, court costs and attorney fees. The purchaser may pay in full at the sale if he/she chooses to do so. Otherwise, the purchaser immediately after the sale shall pay not less than 10% of the purchase price, and execute bond with surety, who is a Kentucky resident with net worth of greater or equal to the amount of the bond and who is approved by the Master Commissioner, and who must be present at the sale and execute the sale bond and affidavit of surety at the sale, for the balance of the purchase price, payable to the Fleming Circuit Court Clerk within thirty days with interest at 6% per annum on the balance from date of sale until paid in full. The bond shall have the force of a judgment and a first lien shall be retained on the property as security for the payment of said bond and interest. The purchaser shall at his/her own expense carry fire and extended coverage insurance on all insurable improvements located on the real property from the date of sale until the purchase price is paid in full, with loss payable to the Master Commissioner. The purchaser shall be required to assume and pay all taxes assessed against the property for 2025 and all subsequent years.
