The fire was extinguished with a loss of \$100.00 The 17 firemen remained at the scene for a half hour. The bolt first hit a locust tree and then the barn. The barn fire was first seen by Ernest Hamm at a distance of mile away. He notified the city hall. No damage resulted from the bolt that struck the utility pole. Electric service was disrupted for a time.
