

WHEREAS, the Fleming County Fiscal Court on August 12, 2025, determined the tax rates necessary to produce sufficient revenues for the operation of county government and services:

(D) Inventory in Transit 0.0 cents per \$100

Section Two: The Fleming County Fiscal Court hereby approves the tax rates of assessed valuation as set forth below for each Special District or other taxing district:

Real Estate Personal Vehicle Health 5.0 cents 5.0 cents Library 7.5 cents 11.00 cents 4.6 cents 2.5 cents Extension 6.2 cents

Ambulance 8.6 cents Timberland 2.5 cents per acre

Soil Conservation 1.5 cents Fox Creek Conservancy 1.5 cents
