Also students taking the course do not have to take the state's four-hour Graduating Licensing Course. Students will learn maneuvering skills, drive in towns and cities as well as country settings. On Saturday, February 22, the Logan's Fort Historic Site in Stanford, Lincoln County, Kentucky, was the setting for a significant historical event—the dedication of the America 250! Revolutionary War Patriot Marker. The event, organized by the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (NSDAR) and supported by multiple Kentucky DAR chapters, honored the men and women who contributed to American independence.

The ceremony began with a presentation by the Kentucky Society Sons of the American Revolution Color Guard, followed by an invocation led by Janet Nustad, member of the Logan-Whitley Chapter. Attendees stood for the Pledge of Allegiance, reaffirming their commitment to the nation's founding ideals.

LEGAL NOTICE
The Kentucky Transportation Cabinet
In accordance with KRS 176.051, Kentucky's noxious weed law, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet will control noxious weeds on state-owned right of way at the request of the adjoining property owner. The noxious weeds named in this law are Johnson grass (*Sorghum halepense*), Canada thistle (*Cirsium arvense*), Cutleaf Teasel (*Dipsacus laciniatus*) Nodding thistle (*Carduus nutans*), Common teasel (*Dipsacus fullonum*), Poison hemlock (*Conium maculatum*), Marestalk (*Conyza canadensis*), Amur Honeysuckle (*Lonicera maackii*), Multiflora Rose (*Rosa multiflora*) Japanese knotweed, (*Polygonum cuspidatum*), Spotted Knapweed (*Centaurea stoebe*) and Kudzu (*Pueraria montana*).

Persons who own property adjacent to state right of way and who are involved in eradication efforts on their property can submit a written application to the highway district office in their area. Contact information can be found at transportation.ky.gov/DistrictPages
