
After School Driving Program

The driving program at Garrard County High School will be starting up again this spring for March and April. The cost is \$180. Authorities state that Sparks unlawfully entered the home through a window, leading to a confrontation with the residents. The occupants awoke to find him inside and immediately notified law enforcement. During the incident, Sparks allegedly threatened the residents and caused damage inside the home, including burning a hole in the floor

Sparks faces several charges, including Third-Degree Burglary (KRS 511.040), Third-Degree Criminal Trespassing (KRS 511.080), Second-Degree Criminal Mischief (KRS 512.030), and Third-Degree Terroristic Threatening (KRS 508.080).
