son, Jamon Feltner, 25, both of whom now face charges of fourth-degree assault under Kentucky law.

According to documents filed by the Lancaster Police Department, officers arrived at the scene around 4:29 p.m. following an assault complaint. Upon arrival, officers made contact with Jamon Feltner, who admitted to striking his mother, Kathryn Feltner, in the mouth. The altercation reportedly stemmed from a confrontation between Kathryn and Jamon's girlfriend. Kathryn allegedly threw a case of Bubly soda at the girlfriend, hitting her in the face and chest, which prompted Jamon to intervene by striking his mother.

Jamon told police that he was attempting to de-escalate the situation by physically separating the two women. However,

to the ground and punched her in the back and the head in an attempt to stop the altercation. The victim corroborated portions of the account, stating that she and Kathryn were engaged in a verbal dispute when Kathryn hit her in the face and threw the soda case, causing

A separate citation involving Jamon Feltner revealed additional details about a prior domestic incident. According to that report, filed by a different officer, the confrontation reportedly arose from a disagreement over a climate control device in their home. The argument turned physical when Kathryn

THE GARRARD CENTRAL RECORD, APRIL 10, 2025 - A - 7 allegedly removed the device from the wall, leading to Jamon assaulting her and causing visible injuries to her face and arms.

Both Kathryn and Jamon Feltner were arrested and transported to Jessamine County Detention Center. They have been charged with Assault in the Fourth Degree, a Class A misdemeanor in Kentucky. The charges against Kathryn relate to alleged physical violence against her son's girlfriend, while Jamon faces charges for separate assaults on both women during the course of the dispute.

Court proceedings for both individuals will take place in Garrard County. The citations have been marked as not prepayable, requiring mandatory court appearances.

The Lancaster Department has not released further details regarding the condition of those involved or any pending protective orders.

Disarming Officer From Front

According to the Lancaster Police Department, officers were dispatched to Pemberton's residence following a complaint from his parents, who reported that Pemberton was intoxicated and causing a disturbance. Despite his parents' wishes to have him removed from the home, officers advised that Pemberton could not legally be removed unless medically cleared by EMS.

When EMS arrived to evaluate Pemberton, authorities say he became verbally aggressive. Officer Noah Allen and Officer Kirk Mays attempted to calm Pemberton, but he allegedly responded by issuing threats and demonstrating violent behavior. At one point, Pemberton report-

identified a firearm holstered on Officer Allen. According to the citation, Pemberton attempted to retrieve the weapon during the confrontation, prompting a physical altercation.

Officer Allen was able to subdue Pemberton temporarily to prevent him from accessing the firearm. Pemberton allegedly continued to resist arrest, striking officers and refusing to comply with verbal commands. As officers attempted to handcuff him, he reportedly fought to gain control of the taser, leading to additional charges.

Pemberton was eventually subdued and handcuffed with the assistance of multiple officers. EMS personnel were then able to complete their evaluation, during which Pemberton continued to act aggressively. He allegedly made threats toward officers, voiced complaints of knee pain, and created

what the citation describes as a "nublic nuisance."

Given the apparent level of intoxication and concerns regarding his behavior, Pemberton was transported to Fort Logan Hospital for further evaluation before being taken to the Jessamine County Detention Center. Officer Mays accompanied the EMS crew during the transport to ensure safety.

Pemberton faces five charges, including resisting arrest, assault in the third degree on a police or probation officer, terroristic threatening in the third degree, disarming a peace officer, and disorderly conduct in the second degree.

The citation states that the charges are not prepayable, and he is scheduled to appear in Garrard County court.
