# **Summer Has Officially Started**

Summer has officially started, and we are finally receiving the warmth of the sun after so many days of rain. As a lifelong gardener I will never complain about the rain as I know too well what the opposite of that will be. Keep a close eye on all the weeds and invasive grasses that have popped up almost overnight and get them pulled out before they set their roots into the ground. In my cut flower gardens I use a lot of straw in my pathways to keep the weeds down and the ground moist. Over the many years it has richly blessed the earth as it has broken down and composted back into the soil. I shake down about 10" of straw after I have removed any weeds and it does a wonderful job!

If you haven't moved your

houseplants outside yet it's not too late, especially on any cloudy, rainy days. Don't forget to start them in partial shade or they will sunburn just as we do. Make sure that you remember to water them on a weekly basis or more if necessary. I have just finished planting and staking my Dahlias so if you spot some on sale go ahead and get them planted. Dahlias can grow from 2'-6' depending on the variety so make sure you have access to sturdy stakes. Some gardeners use heavy duty tomato cages or tomato stakes but here on the farm, I use tobacco sticks and baling twine. Granted it's not attractive but it is free, and it does work. The time to stake them is when you plant them, so you won't accidently damage the tuber. Also, you still have time to plant Gladiolus bulbs for late flowers. They need some support as well and need to be planted deeply to help support the root growth. In this case I have a 4' tall wire fence that I roll out and cut to fit the bed. I use rebar and zip ties to attach to the fence allowing the gladiolus to grow through this. Remember to leave the foliage on your Spring blooming bulbs such as tulips, daffodils, hyacinths, etc. as that's what feeds them for next years blooms. After looking over your flower beds and borders it's not too late to add a few perennials (they come back every year) or annuals (one season only). I have seen a few garden centers offering discounted prices so now is a good time to purchase a few more. Keep any newly planted plants well-watered and they should take off and give you several months of bloom. Keep an eye out for any signs of insects on your shrubs, trees, fruits, etc. as this is the time that they are devouring foliage and fruit. Take samples of any damage to the extension office to identify what it is and what you can do to prevent it. Don't worry about the invasion of the Cicadas ("the Rip Van Winkles of the insect world"). They are harmless to us unless they fly directly into your face which is only a mild contact. They have left numerous holes in the ground as they ventured out of their 17-year underground nap that will help to aerate the soil and give space for other creatures. They should all be gone by the end of June so in the meantime just enjoy their endless chatter. I personally love to hear the sounds of summer, bugs and all. If you have rhododendrons and laurel, make sure to break off the old flower heads after blooming. Only the heads and not the branches. As you can see there are many jobs to be done in the garden every day, week and month. I spend most of my mornings outside working away, enjoying the sounds of the birds, and watching the garden wake up.

Enjoy these warm, sunny days of summer as we get outside to play or garden in our own yards. There are several garden tours in the surrounding area coming up. Check online or in the paper for listings. It's a great way to see what other gardeners are doing in their yards to inspire us in our own.
