### **Church Mutiny** From Front

by authorities detail charges filed against Kimberly G. Fields and Bobby Lee Fields, both residents of Lancaster. The citations state that on June 29, 2025, deputies responded to a call at Dix River Pentecostal Church, located on Stanford Road, regarding an alleged disturbance involving two previously trespassed individuals. Both Kimberly Fields, 63, and Bobby Fields, 60, were cited at the scene but not arrested. They have been charged with criminal trespassing in the third degree under Kentucky statute 511.080. Their court date has been set for July 21, 2025, at 9:00 a.m. in Garrard District Court.

Sheriff Skeens described the situation as a "delicate" and ongoing conflict within the church community. In a recorded interview, he confirmed that the Fieldses had previously been removed from their roles as preacher and preacher's wife by

the church leadership. Following this decision, the church leadership requested that they be formally trespassed from the property. Law enforcement complied with the request and served them with a trespass order several weeks prior to the June 29 incident.

On the day of the incident, the Fieldses reportedly returned to the church during Sunday services, prompting a 911 call. Sheriff's deputies responded and found that the individuals were still under active trespass orders and had not received any formal rescission. As such, citations were issued.

"We only deal with what's legal and what is not legal," Sheriff Skeens said. "The internal workings of the church, the bylaws, the leadership disputes-those are matters they'll have to navigate as a church body. We just make sure everyone is safe and the law is followed."

No arrests were made, and no further individuals were cited

during the response. While some confusion was reported over the number of people present in support of each party during the service-ranging from 10 to 20 individuals coming in with the Fieldses, according to radio traffic. However the Fieldses were the only two individuals who had violated an existing trespass order and were subject to legal action.

Sheriff Skeens noted that while law enforcement involvement in church disputes is uncommon and regrettable, his department's responsibility remains focused on public safety and legal compliance

"You really hate to see law enforcement have to get involved in church," he said.

The situation has highlighted ongoing tensions within the congregation, but authorities emphasized that the matter remains strictly legal in scope from the Sheriff's Department's perspective. The court will determine any further outcomes when the case is heard later this month.
