tion filed by the Garrard County Sheriff's Department, deputies were dispatched at approximately 8:50 p.m. to Kennedy Bridge Road following a report of a male individual yelling profanities. The discussion began under New Business item number three, where Mayor Gaffney noted the inclusion of the CPPP resolution paperwork in the council's meeting packets. After confirming the document's presence and that it had been reviewed by City Attorney Jonathan Baker, the mayor clarified that the funding would support much-needed blacktop replacement on two specific streets. The funding will support infrastructure improvements on South Campbell Street and Hamilton Avenue, with work expected to commence in the near future.

ing construction and modifications aimed at improving traffic flow and safety in the area.

The reopening comes with several temporary and permanent changes to traffic patterns. Although all four lanes will become accessible, the speed limit will remain reduced to 45 miles per hour due to ongoing rough road conditions. Officials have indicated that this speed restriction is a precautionary measure until the roadway is resurfaced.

A new layer of blacktop is scheduled to be installed after a short settling period to ensure the structural integrity of the road. In the meantime, drivers are advised to expect some uneven surfaces and to maintain heightened awareness while navigating the area.

Among the functional changes, the left-turn lane into Old Lexington Road East from the southbound side of U.S. 27 will be reinstated. However, drivers exiting Rogers Road and Old Lexington Road East will now be required to use a turnaround to make right turns, indicating a shift in how traffic exits those inter-

Mayor Gaffney acknowledged those observations and encouraged continued input from council members ahead of a separate grant application deadline later this summer.

funding opportunity of up to \$500,000. As part of that application, the city is conducting detailed street condition documentation, including photographs taken every 300 feet along city roads.

Following the discussion, Councilman Marshall Norton moved to authorize the mayor to sign the CPPP resolution. The motion was seconded and unanimously approved by the council.

The funding and the resolution mark a step forward in the city's infrastructure improvement efforts, with more projects potentially on the horizon depending on the outcome of the Bluegrass grant application. The mayor encouraged any additional street recommendations from council members to be submitted within the next month.

The intersection improvements are part of a broader infrastructure initiative aimed at enhancing transportation safety and efficiency in Garrard County.

Further updates will be provided as the resurfacing schedule is finalized.
