Kentucky Farm Bureau Awards More Than \$810,000 In Scholarships To Kentucky Students, Its Highest Total Ever

The Kentucky Farm Bureau (KFB) Education Foundation today announced it has awarded the highest amount in post-secondary education scholarships in the program's history. In partnership with county Farm Bureaus, the KFB Foundation awarded 601 Kentucky high school seniors a total of \$810,150 in scholarships at both the state and county level. This brings the total amount of scholarships awarded to over \$3.9 million since the program's inception in 1953.

Garrard County award winners include Lizzy Gallegos and Jaydon Noe receiving the Garrard County Farm

Bureau Henry West Agriculture Scholarship - \$2,000 and James Seagraves receiving the KFB Education Foundation Scholarship - \$1,000.

"Our investment in young people is an investment in the future of Kentucky," said Eddie Melton, KFB President. "We're proud to support these outstanding students who are working hard today, and who are well on their way to becoming the leaders of tomorrow. Whether their academic paths lead them to agriculture or another field, Kentucky Farm Bureau is honored to walk beside them as they take their next steps."

Statewide scholarships include students attending a Kentucky college or university who are pursuing a degree in agriculture or a related field; students attending a Kentucky college or university who are pursuing a four-year degree in animal health/veterinary technology or a related field; students attending a Kentucky college or university who come from farm families; and more. A total of 110 county Farm Bureaus awarded scholarships to local students.

Not have had a PSA (blood test for prostate cancer) in the past year.

According to the American Cancer Society's estimates, 313,780 cases of prostate cancer are expected to be diagnosed in 2025, and 35,770 men are anticipated to die from the

disease. About one in eight men will have prostate cancer in their lifetime. Prostate cancer is more likely to develop in older men and in non-Hispanic black men. About six cases in 10 are diagnosed in men who are 65 or older, and is rare in men under 40. The average age of men when they are first

TAX RATE APPROVAL GARRARD COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION

The Garrard County Board of Education will meet at the Garrard Education Center on Thursday, August 21, 2025 at 6:00 p.m. One action item will be to approve a General Fund tax levy of 62.5 cents on real property and 64.0 cents on personal property. The General Fund tax levied in fiscal year 2025 was 62.6 cents on real property and 64 cents on personal property. Per KDE guidance, a tax hearing and public advertisement of the tax hearing is no longer required unless the Board of Education is adopting a tax rate above 4%. While not required, the Garrard County Board of Education is advertising the change in tax rate for full transparency with the

WHEREAS, the City Council has previously passed an ordinance outlying the usage of Golf Carts within the City;

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it necessary to amend ordinances from time to time; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the

1. The ordinance shall be amended to reflect the

passage of Senate Bill 63. 2. The ordinance shall include not only Golf

Carts, but also "street-legal special purpose" vehicles as well. These include ATV and UTV's. 3. These street-legal special vehicles must be equipped with a roll bar and/or roll cage, turn signals and seatbelts.

4. All previous rules, regulations, inspection and permitting processes apply.
