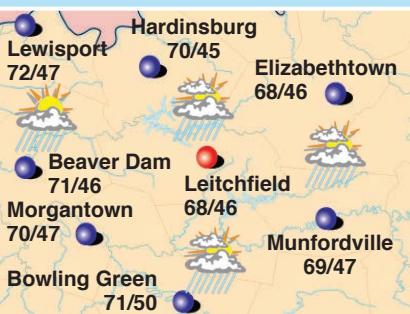

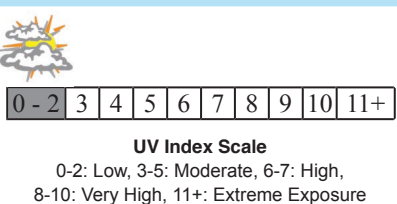

### Weather History

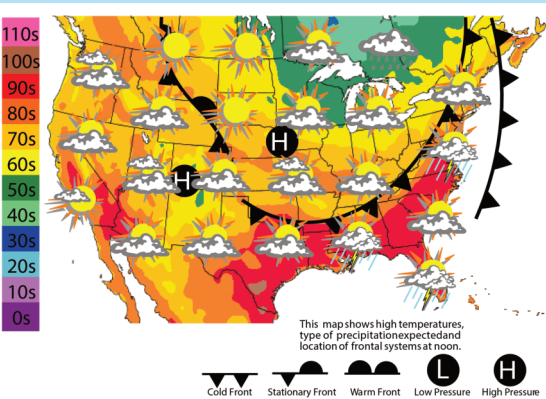
