Local leader shares lessons on learning

Carrie Truitt addresses **Taylor County** chamber

The Campbellsville-Taylor County Chamber of Commerce welcomed a Marion County resident who plays a lead role in Leadership Kentucky.

Speaking at the chamber's monthly luncheon last stressed the connection between learning and

collectively come together to learn and share in order to advance the community and state and make it better for all.

A key concern of the state Leadership organization, since its founding, has been the rural-urban divide and the need for mutual understanding, Truitt said. Learning to understand and appreciate each other helps identify "common threads" impacting the entire state.

Through her work with Leadership Kentucky, Truitt said she and others strive to identify common issues around the state including affordable housing, workforce

Truitt said the goal is to development to address of others through nonprofit extensive job vacancies and preparing students for their next steps whether its college, trade schools or moving directly into the workforce.

"All of those challenges and opportunities exist in every single community across the state," she said, and bringing leaders together is a means to find solutions. "Let's learn from each

other, let's talk to each other and let's collaborate in fixing problems," she said.

Truitt, who has a master's degree in organizational leadership from Campbellsville University, has invested her entire professional career in the service and Eleanor.
