Fogle has probation revoked, sentenced imposed

Robert Lee Fogle appeared in Marion Circuit Court Division 1 on July 24 where Judge Todd Spalding revoked his probation.

During his probation revocation hearing, Spalding heard testimony from Probation Officer Andrea Thompson, and ruled that Fogle had again violated the terms of his probation by leaving treatment after nine days. Fogle was on probation for drug charges.

“The defendant has been sanction previously on multiple occasions and cannot be managed by Probation and Parole,” Spalding noted. He then revoked Fogle’s probation and imposed a sentence of two years and closed

the case.

- Joey Burton pleaded guilty and was sentenced on the following charges: Theft by unlawful taking or disposition all others \$1,000 but under \$10,000 (3 years pretrial diverted for 5 years), and second-degree unlawful transaction with a minor (3 years pretrial diverted for 5 years). He was also ordered to pay restitution of \$2,020.
- Michael Kursinsky had a probation revocation hearing where the court heard testimony from Lebanon Police Sgt. Henry Keene and Probation Officer Andrea Thompson and found that Kursinsky violated the terms of his probation by failure

Miles pleads guilty, to be sentenced in September

The man charged with multiple counts relating to possessing and distributing obscene material appeared in Marion Circuit Court Division 2 on July 24 to enter a plea.

Joshua Edward Miles appeared before Judge Kaelin Reed and pleaded guilty to procuring or promoting the use of a minor by electronic means, eight counts of possession of matter portraying a sexual performance by a minor 12-

18 years old (amended from possession of matter portraying a sexual performance by a minor under 12), and seven counts of distributing

obscene material to minors, first offense. He also had the sex offender registration act read and Judge Reed set his sentencing date for Sept. 29 at 1:00 p.m.

Miles was arrested on May 1, 2024, by the Kentucky State Police Electronic Crime Branch after the branch discovered Miles
