Hodgenville hosting public hearing Monday on tax rates

Hodgenville City Council is hosting a public hearing at 5:30 p.m. Monday to obtain comments regarding its proposed 2025 property tax rates.

The city proposes lowering its real and personal property tax rates from 11.8 cents per \$100 in assessed value to 10.9 cents. The new rate is expected to produce \$244,859 in revenue, approximately \$14,000 more than last year.

The 2025 compensating rate – the rate which would produce no new revenue over the previous year – is 10.5 cents per \$100 in assessed value. It would produce a revenue of \$235,873.

Per state law, government agencies wishing to levy a tax that exceeds the compensating rate are required to hold a public hearing.

According to Hodgenville Mayor Jim Phelps, the city can decrease its property tax rates yet still generate more revenue than what was collected in 2024 because of “controlled growth.” This statement is corroborated by the \$28.9 million increase in total property assessments within the city over the past year.

Per the city’s advertisement, any additional tax dollars received from growth in assessment values will be proportionately spent within all city departments and programs which use local tax dollars in order to meet the operational costs associated with providing basic level of service to the community.

The public hearing allows city residents to voice their opinion on the proposed tax rate. The council will convene for its regularly-scheduled meeting at 6 p.m., where it is expected to consider approval of the 10.9 cent rate.
