

# Kentucky renews reciprocal agreements for sportsmen with neighbors

Kentucky anglers and waterfowl hunters can use their resident licenses on certain shared waters with neighboring states under new reciprocal agreements that took effect last week.

The agreements were finalized following adjournment of the Kentucky Interim Joint Committee on Natural Resources and Energy, according to a news release from the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources.

The department said reciprocal fishing agreements cover the Ohio and Mississippi rivers, Kentucky Lake, Dale Hollow Lake, the Big South Fork of the Cumberland River and the Big Sandy and Tug Fork rivers. Reciprocal waterfowl hunting agreements include the Big Sandy and Tug Fork rivers bordering West Virginia and sections of the Ohio River bordering Indiana and Ohio.

“We’re blessed here in the

Commonwealth – and across our neighboring states – with so many great places to get out and enjoy the outdoors,” Fish and Wildlife Commissioner Rich Storm said in the release. “We’re extremely proud of these new agreements because they make it easier for our valued license holders and our neighbors to get out there and take advantage of all the opportunities our shared waters have to offer.”

Under the agreements, residents can fish or waterfowl hunt in the listed reciprocal waters using a license from their own state.

Hunters and anglers must follow the regulations and season dates of the state in which they are licensed; however, those fishing or hunting from the bank must follow the regulations of that state.

On the Mississippi River bordering Missouri, different rules apply and anglers should consult the fishing section of the state handbook for details.

The agreements apply only to the main stem of the rivers. Hunters or anglers using an embayment or tributary off the main stem must be licensed in that state and follow its regulations.

The release said embayments and tributaries are defined as a straight line between opposite points where the tributary or embayment connects with the main body of the river. Kentucky law requires resident hunters and anglers utilizing reciprocal waters to have a Kentucky-issued license.

**FISHING DETAILS**

According to the department, the Ohio River agreement includes its main stem bordering Illinois, Indiana and Ohio. Embayments and tributaries are not included. Anglers must obey the regulations of the state in which they are licensed unless fishing from the bank, in which case they must follow the regulations of the state where they are fishing.

On the Mississippi River along the Missouri border, anglers must follow the rules of the state in which they are fishing; if licensed in one state but fishing in another, they must comply with the most restrictive regulation. Bank anglers must obey the regulations of the state where they are fishing.

For Kentucky Lake, reciprocal waters extend from Egner’s Ferry Bridge (U.S. 68/80) in Kentucky south to Gov. Ned McWherter Bridge (U.S. 79 and TN 76) in Tennessee. This includes all tributaries and embayments except the Blood River embayment in Kentucky.

At Dale Hollow Lake, the reciprocal waters are the Wolf River arm, including the Illwill Creek embayment beginning at a line crossing the Wolf River at its mouth where it meets the Obey River and the main part of the lake.

The Big South Fork of the Cumberland River agreement covers waters from the KY 92 bridge at Yamacraw in Kentucky upstream to the

Leatherwood Ford Bridge in Tennessee (TN 297).

The Big Sandy River and Tug Fork River agreements require anglers to obey regulations of their home state unless fishing from the bank, when they must follow the rules of the state where they are fishing.

**HUNTING DETAILS**

The release said reciprocal agreements for waterfowl hunting were renewed for the Ohio River bordering Indiana and Ohio, and the Big Sandy and Tug Fork rivers bordering West Virginia.

“With duck and goose seasons opening Nov. 27, we were anxious to lock down these agreements in time for waterfowl hunters to take advantage of them,” Storm said. “We’ve accomplished that goal.”

Hunters licensed in Kentucky may hunt the main stem of the Ohio River bordering Indiana and Ohio and the Tug Fork and Big Sandy rivers bordering West

Virginia. They must follow Kentucky’s regulations and season dates when hunting waters included in the agreements, but if hunting off the bank in another state, follow that state’s rules.

The agreements only apply to the main stems of the Ohio River, Big Sandy River and Tug Fork River. Areas within tributaries or embayments of the main stem are subject to the season dates, regulations and licensing of the state in which they are located.

Hunters and anglers should follow the regulations and license requirements of whatever state in which they are fishing or hunting when not covered by reciprocal agreements.

# Lowe shoulder is concern out of UK Blue-White game

Kentucky men’s basketball point guard Jaland Lowe stole the headlines following the 2025 Blue-White game, but not for the expected reasons.

Taking the court as a member of the White team, things took a turn in the second half of the scrimmage when a collision with Otega

Oweh would see Lowe go down hard clutching his right shoulder.

After being down for a moment, Lowe was helped to his feet by training staff and immediately left the court and went into the locker room. The White team would fall 35-26 and Mark Pope and the Kentucky staff decided to end things there instead of playing bonus

basketball that had been teased prior.

“He tweaked his shoulder, so we’ll see,” Pope said in the post-game news conference. “(We) set him down out of caution. We’ll know more tomorrow, we’ll get some imaging.”

Lowe transferred to Kentucky in the offseason from Pittsburgh and is expected to be the Wildcats’

starting point guard.

With Pitt last season, Lowe finished with 16.8 points and 5.5 assists per game while shooting 37% from the field.

Freshman Jasper Johnson also was asked about Lowe’s injury and whether he would be comfortable having to step into a larger role if things are negative with Lowe’s imaging.

“I’m very comfortable,”

Johnson said. “I know he may go down, but we are a team. I know everybody is willing to step up (in) their role. I know he’s a big part of our team right now, playing the one, being the head of our snake. We don’t know much in detail of his injury, but we’re all, you know, still being with him through this process.”

Before leaving the

scrimmage, Lowe scored three baskets on six attempts (50%) for nine points. He went 1-2 from beyond the arch. He also had two rebounds and one assist.

Kentucky may be forced to move forward in his absence during an exhibition Friday in Rupp Arena against No. 1 Purdue. That contest will begin at 6 p.m. and air live on the SEC Network.
