

GOP hosts Kirk memorial

SHEPHERDSVILLE — The Bullitt County Republican Party hosted a memorial service for Charlie Kirk on the anniversary of what would've been his birthday. The event took place at the Bullitt Central High School football field, with about 200 in attendance. Among the guest speakers were State Senator Mike Names, State Representative Thomas Huff, and Shepherdsville Mayor Jose Cubero. Many other local GOP officials were also in attendance.

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Mooney who is also one of the state's top cross-country runners. She recalled the earlier 50 regular season win over Bullitt Central, a game that was stopped with 30 minutes to play because of lightning in the area. "I honestly figured we would do it," she said of the 'mercy' rule victory. "I thought we would do it the last time (we played them). I did expect us to have a good game tonight." Mooney said the team really did not change anything to face McKendree. "Not really," she said. "We talked (before the game) with the center backs just to make sure to know where she was. We needed someone on her back, but not all the time." The Lady Chargers were the pre-season favorite to win a third consecutive Sixth Region title as they returned every player from last season's team that beat Mercy 3-2 in the championship game. That can put pressure on some teams, but it has not seemed to affect this group of girls. "I don't know if we ever relaxed," Mooney said. "There are steps we have taken to prepare for the state tournament and how we can get past the first round of the state tournament." Bullitt East will take on the winner of the Seventh Region in the first-round of the state tournament. The Seventh Region final is not going to be played until 5 p.m. on Saturday with defending state champion Sacred Heart taking on Christian Academy. Bullitt East defeated Christian Academy 2-1 during the season, but did not fare well against Sacred Heart in a pre-season scrimmage. Tentatively, the game is set for Monday at 7 p.m. at the

winner of the Seventh Region final. On the defensive end of the field, senior Adyson Gray was proud of not giving up a goal throughout the regional tournament. "I think it was very special," she said. "I don't know if anyone has done that through a regional. It feels like a big accomplishment to me. A shutout is one of the best feelings." Bullitt Central goal keeper Malia Hagan was under constant pressure in this game. The sophomore made several nice saves, but she could not stop all of the shots. Bullitt East opened the scoring just over three minutes into the match. Lady Charger sophomore Avery Adams found an open spot 30-yards out from the goal. She took a pass from Hartley Masters and when the Bullitt Central defense did not close out on her, she drilled the long shot over Hagan and just under the crossbar. It was 13 minutes later when Masters made another assist when she got the ball to Mooney just inside where Adams had scored earlier. Mooney hit a direct shot over Hagan's head and into the net. At the 14:50 mark, Bullitt Central got its first shot of the game, but Lady Charger goal keeper Sophia Price made the stop and then quickly got to the ball to her offense. Mooney got the ball over midfield and then fed a pass to Beth Wheeler who out ran the defense to the ball. The senior then beat Hagan low from point-blank range. By this point, the flow of the game was certainly in Bullitt East's favor. The Lady Chargers added another goal when they got the ball in front of the goal. Anna Tinelli deflected a pass that Wheeler pushed past Hagan. Mooney made it 5-0 at the 6:33 mark when she dribbled around some defenders and scored from

close range. Adams assisted on that goal and then in the final minute of the half, Adams fed Mooney who made a long run to from inside the box. In the second half, Adams picked up her third assist of the night when she fed senior Mikena Chitwood who was racing down the left side and converted from close range. The game then ended at the 29:17 mark when Sadie Isaacs kicked a ball off a Bullitt Central player that went to Brynley Uptain who redirected it into the net. While the loss was the end of the season for Bullitt Central, it was not a bitter ending. This was the first time a Lady Cougar team had reached the championship game of a regional tournament since the program shifted to the Sixth Region in 2005. This was a team that just two seasons ago won a pair of games, both over Southern. This team won 16 games and with only four seniors, the program looks to be in position to continue to improve and make deep post-season runs be commonplace. Bullitt East just had a huge advantage in experience playing at this level. "This was our first time for us to be here," Bullitt Central head coach Sarah Sloan said. "So yes, we had some nerves." Savannah Mooney had the better opportunities to shine than the Bullitt Central's Savannah did. "She is 100 percent very good," Sloan said of Mooney. "I think the difference is Savannah Mooney had more opportunities (in this game). We made some changes (in positioning) and those did not work out very well. That is on me. "We only had four seniors," the coach added. "Most of our key people are coming back. We've got some talented younger kids coming up that I am excited about."

(FYI – Bullitt East needed to score in the closing minutes to win the junior-varsity contest this season against Bullitt Central, an indication that this rivalry is just being reignited.)
