The late surge for the Lady Eagles started with a basket by Bailee Morris and then back-to-back three-pointers from Piper Stanley pushed Eastside ahead 41-40 with less than a minute remaining in the game. Eastside added free throws from Claire Bates and Stanley before Bates converted two late free throws to account for the final score.

Stanley finished as the games' leading scorer with 14 points while Edie Forrest added ten points.

Mount Washington got 12 points each from the Petrowski sisters, Charley and younger sister, Alex, while Chloe Risinger finished with ten points.

This is the third season that Clayton Stallings has been the head coach at Mount Washington at the program that his aunt, Christal Scott, guided for 25 years. For the first two seasons at the helm, Hoben was his top assistant coach.

During this first season on opposite benches, Mount Washington had run the table on Eastside, going 11-0 at the three age groups. That all changed with the big fourth quarter in the championship game.

"I told the girls at that final timeout that we had to win the game with defense and we had to hit some shots," Hoben said. "We hit some really big shots including those three-pointers.

"I have always had confidence in this group," the first-year head coach said. "It's a good group of girls just to be around. From day one I

thought this group could do this. If we play our game I thought we could beat anyone. Sometimes we get lazy. But when we move we are a pretty good team."

The win left Eastside with an 18-4 record. Three of the losses came to Mount Washington and the other was to My Old Kentucky Home Middle School in Nelson County.

My Old Kentucky Home also hung a loss on Mount Washington, the only game the Lady Generals lost during the season before the loss to Eastside on Thursday. The season ended for Mount Washington with a 21-2 record.

"I thought that Eastside would have to play really well to beat us," Stallings said. "They played well enough to do that. "Congratulations to Mike for having the team to beat

us," the coach added. "It's not a good feeling to get knocked out like that. It is not the way we wanted to end their careers."

The 8th-grade group lost just five games in three seasons at Mount Washington. They played in six championship games (between the conference and Bullitt County finals) and won five and were runners-up in the other.

"I'm really proud of my group," Stallings said. "Mike runs a good press. They have beat teams all year with it. I'm not upset. We lost, but I could not be more proud of my team."

Players from both teams will now meld into one as they will

now move on to play at Bullitt East under Clayton Stallings' father, Chris Stallings. Charley Petrowski played for the Lady Charger varsity team last season and could be a key cog this winter.

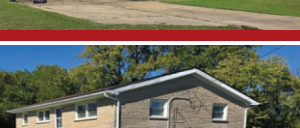
