

SUMMARY OF AN ORDINANCE OF THECITY OF UNIONTOWN ALLOWING THE OPERATION OF STREET-LEGALSPECIAL **PURPOSE VEHICLES ON HIGHWAYS**

Pursuant to KRS 186.077 and KRS 186.078, the City of Uniontown has determined it is appropriate to allow the operation of street-legal special purpose vehicles on highways in the City of Uniontown and hereby repeals Ordinance 23-02. The purpose of this ordinance is to establish rules and regulations to allow for safe and lawful operation of street-legal special purpose vehicles on certain highways within the city limits of the City of Uniontown, Kentucky.

The definitions of KRS 186.077(1) are adopted herein. Street-legal special purpose vehicles must be insured, have equipment set forth in KRS 186.077(1)(c)(1), be inspected, be registered, and must have a motorcycle registration plate. Operators must have a valid operator's license in their possession. Operators are prohibited from traveling a distance greater than twenty (20) miles on a highway displaying centerline pavement markings. Minitrucks shall not be

Violators can be fined up to \$250.00 per violation and are also subjected to penalties as provided by state or federal law.
