-Kelly Sheehan, slated to pitch in the first round

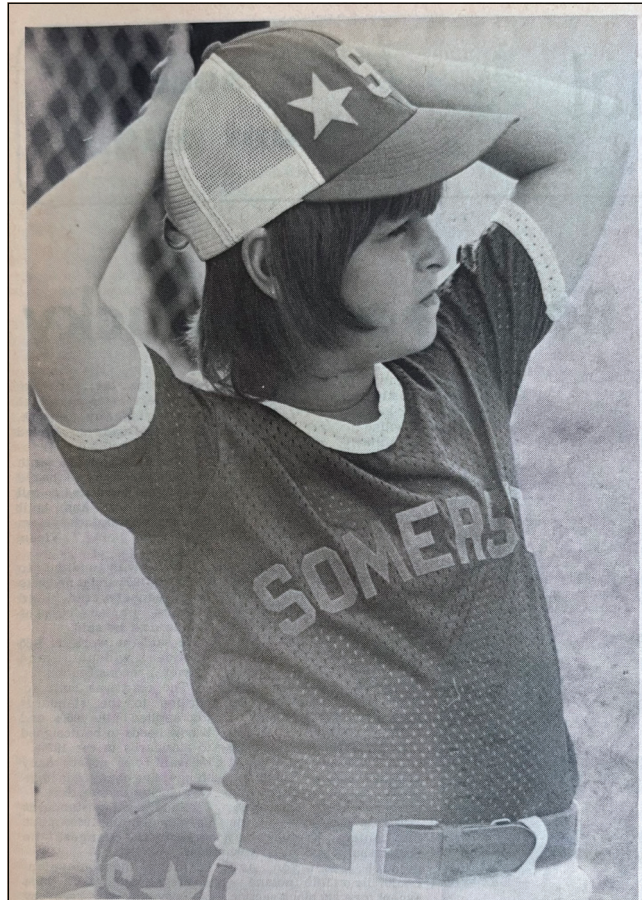
