Others in attendance were City Clerk/ Administrator Dawn Devore, Public Works Superintendent Moe



The Metcalfe County Fiscal Court held its first meeting of 2026 on Thursday, January 8th, with the following in attendance: Judge/ Executive Larry Wilson, Magistrates Ronnie Miller, Daniel Bragg, Harvey Hawkins, and Kevin Crain, County Attorney Sharon Howard, and

Treasurer/Fiscal Court Clerk Page Edwards.

Also in attendance were Financial Officer Connie Taylor, Occupational Tax/ ABC Admin. Lorrie Gilpin, Sheriff Lonnie Hodges, Emergency Mgmt. Director Adam Bennett, Solid Waste Coordinator Kim Jandt, Road Supervisor Chris Compton, and Herald-News editor PJ Martin.

Judge Wilson declared a quorum present, and the agenda was adopted.

The minutes from the December 23rd special-called meeting were approved after motions by Bragg and Hawkins.

Next was a discussion of an amendment to the Solar Panel Ordinance # 25-1023. Attorney Howard explained,



The Kentucky Department of Motor Vehicles has partnered with IDEMIA Public Security North America, the leading provider of secure and trusted biometric-based solutions, in launching the next-generation of mobile ID in Kentucky.

Kentucky residents can now assert their identity securely from their mobile phone by downloading the free app from the Apple App Store or Google Play. State residents can use the app immediately to verify their identities directly from their

mobile phones at TSA Checkpoints at CVG, SDF, LEX, and PAH, in addition to other participating airports across the country.

The Kentucky mobile ID app provides a contactless and easy way for users to verify

their identity, while putting users' privacy and security at the forefront. Mobile ID holders are the only ones who can access the mobile ID by unlocking the app using their biometrics or their
