If you're allergic to a specific substance, a small red bump will appear within minutes.

Intradermal testing, a more sensitive method, involves injecting a small amount of the allergen under the skin. Multiple allergens can be tested if spots are spaced apart. The reactions are checked after 15 to 20 minutes.

A Patch Test is used when checking for numerous allergens. A series of allergens on special tape that contains small aluminum discs (Finn chambers), which contain the individual allergens. This test can check for 30 to over 100 allergens simultaneously.

The specific allergens chosen depend on common local allergies, household products, or the patient's occupation. The common allergens can vary from country to country.

The test strips remain in place for 48 hours, with results usually read by a doctor at around the 96-hour mark.

**Treatments**  
Treatment options vary based on allergy severity and the number of allergens involved:

•Avoid exposure: For milder reactions, avoid allergens by staying indoors during high pollen counts or using medications.

•Daily allergy medications: Nasal sprays and antihistamines to help reduce the symptoms may be prescribed, particularly for seasonal allergies.

•Allergy shots: This treatment, given over three to five years, can decrease your immune system's response to environmental allergens like pollen, mold, dust, and stinging insects.

•Medical alert card: For severe allergic reactions, such as anaphylaxis, you will need to carry a medical alert card or wear medical alert jewelry to alert medical personnel of possible danger from allergens like peanuts or bee stings.

•Epinephrine injector (Epi Pen): This medication is essential for individuals in danger of anaphylaxis. This medication can be lifesaving if immediate medical treatment is not available.

Allergies are not limited to children. Immune systems change as we age, potentially causing new allergies to appear. Insurance usually covers allergy testing; however, it is advisable to check with your individual insurance company for specific coverage or preapproval requirements before undergoing testing.

of prisoners arrested within their county, those sentenced, or held by court order for their county. If the fiscal court contracts with another county for the incarceration and care of prisoners, it is responsible for providing transportation for those prisoners, including a vehicle, a driver, and guards per KRS 441.

In a county without a jail, the judge/executive and the fiscal court can hire one or more deputy transportation officers to assist the jailer. These deputies are under the supervision of the jailer, and the jailer can be held liable on his or her official bond for the conduct of these officers. Deputy transportation officers have the same powers and are subject to the same penalties as the jailer, per KRS 71.

The Department of Corrections has a training program for jailers, and the newly elected jailer must complete a basic training course within one year of taking office, plus annual training per KRS 441.115.

In Metcalfe County, the jailer and his/her deputies are in charge of transferring prisoners after arrest to Barren County Corrections or other county jail facilities in the area. If the arrested person(s) requires medical care, the jailer or deputy must transport them to a hospital or medical facility and guard that person until they are able to be transported to the jail facility.

In some cases, the jailer or deputy must transport the person(s) under arrest to various rehabilitation facilities such as Rivendell or Western State Hospital.

When prisoners at the jail facility are due in court, the jailer or deputy must transport the prisoner(s) to the court facility in whichever county is necessary and then transport the prisoner(s) back to the jail facility after court.

The jailer or deputy may be ordered by a circuit judge or district judge to transport prisoner(s) from one jail facility to another or the penitentiary per KRS 441.520 and 441.540.

According to the Kentucky Association of Counties (KACo), out of the 120 counties in Kentucky, there are currently 77 county jails: 70 full service, 4 regional, and 3 life safety jails.
