 The U.S. Department of Commerce, Economic Development Administration (EDA) is considering a request for Federal assistance from the Muhlenberg County Fiscal Court to renovate the West Kentucky Regional Technical Training Center located at 200 Pritchett Drive in Greenville, Muhlenberg County, Kentucky. Pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA), EDA is conducting an assessment of the potential of the proposed project to affect the environment and/or historic properties. Notice is hereby given that the project is proposed to be located in, or may affect, a floodplain and/or wetland as defined by Executive Order (EO) 11988 and/or EO 11990.
 The project proposes to renovate and expand the West Kentucky Regional Technical Training Center (WKRTTC) at 200 Pritchett Drive, Greenville, Kentucky, by repurposing the former South Muhlenberg Middle School into an expanded regional technical training facility. The existing building contains approximately 65,000 square feet, of which approximately 43,000 square feet of teaching and training areas will be renovated to support high-demand workforce training programs. The project also includes the purchase and installation of specialized technical training equipment needed to operate WKRTTC and deliver hands-on training in advanced manufacturing, welding, HVAC, machine tool/CNC, electrical, digital manufacturing, and classroom technology.
