

Several charged with sex offenses appear in court

Five individuals charged with various sex-related crimes, including against minors, appeared in Marion Circuit Court Division II last week.

• Charles Josh Blanford has his April 28 jury trial remanded and a pretrial conference date of April 16 at 1:00 p.m. set by Judge Kaelin Reed. Blanford is charged with four counts of first-degree rape and one count of first-degree sodomy. He is lodged in the Marion County Detention Center with bail set at \$250,000.

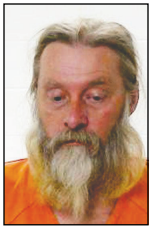
• William R. Bowman had a pretrial conference set for May 7 at 1:00 p.m. He is charged with first-degree unlawful transaction with a minor, illegal sex act under 16 years of age, procuring or promoting the use of a minor by electronic means, and third-degree rape.

• Gerald Jacobs had a pretrial conference set for April 2 at 1:00 p.m. Jacobs is charged with first-degree rape and four counts of first-degree sexual abuse, victim under 12 years of age.

• Dylan Maupin had a pretrial conference date of May

7 at 1:00 p.m. He is charged with first-degree unlawful transaction with a minor, illegal sex act, under 16 years of age, and first-degree sexual abuse.

• Karla Pendleton had a pretrial conference set for May 7 at 1:00 p.m. She is charged with first-degree unlawful transaction with a minor, illegal sex act, under 16 years of age.

OTHER CASES:

• Nicorya Ja'Nee Adams is scheduled to enter a plea on April 2 at 1:00 p.m. She is charged with theft of property mislaid or delivered by mistake, \$1,000 but less than \$10,000.

• Terry Albertson is scheduled to enter a plea on March 19 at 1:00 p.m. Albertson is charged with trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (carfentanil or fentanyl derivatives), drug paraphernalia-buy/possess, public intoxication controlled substances (excludes alcohol), and second-degree persistent felony offender.

• David Lee Bradshaw had a revocation hearing where he stipulated to revocation, and the court voided his diversion and sentenced him to 1 year to run concurrent

with a charge in Nelson County.

• Thomas A. Brady will be sentenced on Oct. 22 at 1:00 p.m. He is charged with first-degree trafficking in a controlled substance, first offense (greater than or equal to 4 grams of cocaine).

• John Harmon is scheduled to enter a plea on March 19 at 1:00 p.m. He is charged with first-degree criminal mischief, operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol, third offense (aggravated circumstance), leaving the scene of an accident/failure to render aid or assistance, operating a vehicle with an expired operator's license, and reckless driving.

• Terry W. Keeling is scheduled to be sentenced on May 7 at 1:00 p.m. Keeling is charged with theft by unlawful taking or disposition-shoplifting-\$1,000 but less than \$10,000.

• Bionica Sikes is scheduled to enter a plea on March 19 at 1:00 p.m. She is charged with first-degree possession of a controlled substance, first offense (drug unspecified), second-degree possession of a controlled substance-hallucinogen, drug paraphernalia-buy/possess, and possession of marijuana.

Man facing 38 charges enters not guilty plea

A man facing 38 charges appeared in Marion Circuit Court Division 1 last week for his arraignment and entered a not guilty plea.

William Knopp is charged with six counts of first-degree wanton endangerment, 28 counts of second-degree wanton endangerment, first-degree criminal mischief, restitution/repair, first offense, operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol .08, first offense (aggravated circumstance), reckless driving, and possession of an open alcohol beverage container in a motor vehicle.

Judge Todd Spalding set a pretrial conference for May 7 at 9:00 a.m., and a jury trial scheduled for Aug. 24 at 8:30 a.m.

• Lea Brockman pleaded guilty and was sentenced on the following charges: First-degree possession of a controlled substance, first offense-

methamphetamine (2 years pretrial diverted for 3 years), third-degree possession of a controlled substance-drug unspecified (12 months probated for 24 months), drug paraphernalia-buy/possess (12 months probated for 24 months), and possession of marijuana (90 days probated for six months). The charge of first-degree possession of a controlled substance (fentanyl) was dismissed. All counts will run concurrently.

• Thomas Draeger, who is charged with two counts of theft by deception-including cold checks-\$10,000 or more, and theft by deception-including cold checks-\$1,000 but less than \$10,000, had a jury trial set for March 23 at 8:30 a.m. with motions in limine at 8:00 a.m. Judge Spalding set a deadline of March 12 at 8:30 a.m. for resolution in the case.

• Eric Reardon pleaded guilty to an amended charge of failure to register as a sex offender, first offense (3 years). His final sentencing date

is set for April 2 at 9:00 a.m.

• William Robertson was sentenced to 1 year on the charge of cultivation of marijuana, 5 plants or more, second or greater offense.

• Jacob Rogers pleaded guilty and was sentenced on the following charges: First-degree possession of a controlled substance, first offense, cocaine (2 years pretrial diverted for 1 year, operating a motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol/substances, second offense, aggravated circumstance (1 year license suspension, served seven days beginning March 13 from Friday at 6:00 p.m. to Sunday at 6:00 p.m., serve the remaining days on March 20 and March 27 at the same time, resisting arrest (12 months probated for 24 months), and possession of marijuana (30 days probated for six months).

• James Wagoner had his 5-year sentence for the charge of third-degree burglary imposed, and the sentencing order was signed.
