offender. The grand jury charged that these events happened on or about Dec. 2, 2025, in Washington County. The bond was set at \$2,500.00 full cash.

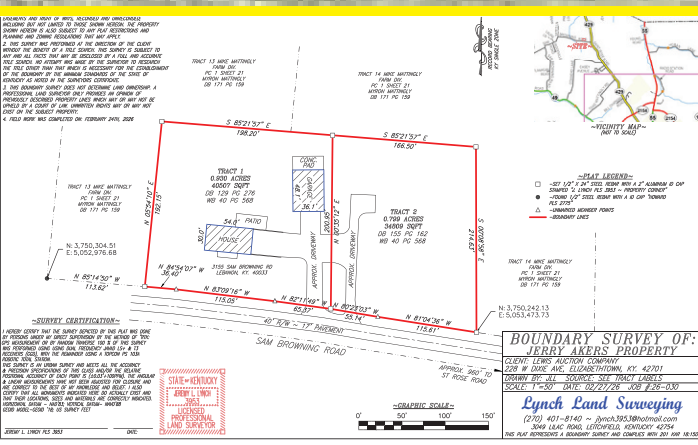
