

# Lady Eagles top Green County but fall to Bethlehem in semis

Campbellsville pulled away to defeat Green County 63-39 during the quarterfinals of the 5th Region Girls' Basketball Tournament at Central Hardin on Monday, March 2.

The Lady Eagles extended their season and advanced to the tournament semifinals by registering the win.

In the win over Green, CHS set the tone early, outscoring Green County 22-6 in the opening quarter and opening the lead to 37-17 by halftime.

Campbellsville shot 32.8 percent from the field for the game and hit 37.5 percent (nine-of-24) from three-point range. From the foul line, CHS added 14 points on 16 tries or 87.5 percent.

Productive inside, CHS also outrebounded Green County 46-34.

Alexis Knifley led Campbellsville to the win, scoring a game-high 25 points. Knifley connected on six of 14 three-point field goal attempts.

Karsyn Smith netted 22 points and five other teammates scored: Symone Headspeth (four points), Londyn Smith (three points), Ammarissa Nunez (three points), Justice Lane (three points) and Amiyah Nunez (three points).

Headspeth provided a strong presence inside for Campbellsville, claiming a game-high 15 rebounds.

Green County was limited offensively, shooting only 28.8 percent from the field, 15.4 percent (two-of-13) from three-point range and 36.8 percent (seven-of-19) from the free throw line.

Scout Brockman paced Green County with a double-double, scoring 15 points and claiming 12 rebounds.

**Bethlehem 62, CHS 45:** By herself, Loren Macy of Bethlehem managed to outscore Campbellsville in the tournament semifinal.

Macy recorded a game-

high double-double, pouring in 49 points to go with 15 rebounds.

Campbellsville couldn't battle back from behind Friday as Bethlehem prevailed 63-45 during 5th Region Girls' Tournament action at Central Hardin.

The loss eliminated Campbellsville from tournament and the season ended with a 20-10 record.

Campbellsville exited the 2025-26 girls' high school basketball season 20-10.

Bethlehem shot 51.1 percent from the field, made four of 14 three-point field

goal attempts and connect on all 13 of its foul shots.

The Banshees also controlled the backboards, outrebounding the Lady Eagles 31-14.

Campbellsville, which enjoyed a turnaround season, shot 40.9 percent from the field and connected on three-of-14 three-point field goal attempts. CHS shot 50 percent (six-of-12) from the free throw line.

Karsyn Smith paced Campbellsville, scoring a team-high 27 points for the Lady Eagles.

Following Smith, Symone

Headspeth (eight points), Amiyah Nunez (six points), Ammarissa Nunez (two points) and Tazaria Owens (two points) accounted for the rest of Campbellsville's scoring.

## Kentucky hosts largest Archery in the Schools state tournament

Kentucky will host the nation's largest annual school archery tournaments Friday and Saturday as 9,241 student archers from 415 schools are expected to compete in the Kentucky National Archery in the Schools Program State Bullseye Tournament.

More than 3,000 of those students are also competing in the NASP State 3D Tournament.

Held at the Kentucky Exposition Center in Louisville since 2016, the tournament has grown into one of the largest state-level sporting competitions held anywhere.

The in-school, co-ed program introduces students in grades 4-12 to international-style target archery. Students learn archery as part of their school curriculum and are then eligible to compete in school-hosted events for the opportunity to qualify for state and national tournaments.

Each year, more than 160,000 Kentucky students learn archery during the

school day as part of their physical education curriculum, and approximately 17,000 compete in Kentucky school-hosted NASP tournaments as part of after-school teams.

In 2002, the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources debuted NASP in Kentucky with 21 pilot schools and it has expanded to more than 900 schools statewide. Nationally, approximately 1.2 million students from more than 9,500 schools participate annually.

Since its inception, NASP has put a bow and arrow in the hands of more than 18 million students and has awarded nearly \$5.4 million in cash scholarships to more than 2,000 students.

The 2026 Kentucky NASP state championships will feature two competitions: a traditional bullseye tournament, where archers shoot at a multi-ringed target, and a 3D tournament, where archers shoot at six lifelike foam targets representing various North American game animals.
