### RUNNIN' REBELS GOLF SCRAMBLE SET FOR JUNE 6

OWENTON — Registration is underway for Owen County Parks & Rec Youth Soccer. All age groups for Owen County Parks & Rec Youth Soccer are co-ed. A breakdown of the age groups by birthdays follows. U4: Aug. 1, 2022-July 31, 2023. U6: Aug. 1, 2020-July 31, 2022. U8: Aug. 1, 2018-July 31, 2020. U10: Aug. 1, 2016-July 31, 2018. U12: Aug. 1, 2014-July 31, 2016. U14: Aug. 1, 2012-July 31, 2014. Players may play up only if they are within one year of the age

cutoff. Due to liability reasons, players may not play down under any circumstance. U4 teams won't play games but will have one 30-minute practice week over a six-week season. U6 teams will have one practice per week and one game per week on a weeknight. U8 teams and older will have one to two practices per week and games on Saturdays. In addition, U8 teams and older could have local weeknight games occasionally. Along with having home games, U8 and older teams will travel to Trimble, Carroll and Gallatin counties for matches. Each child needs a soccer ball, shin guards and cleats. The registration fee for U4 is \$40 per child. The registration fee for U6-U14 is \$75 per child. 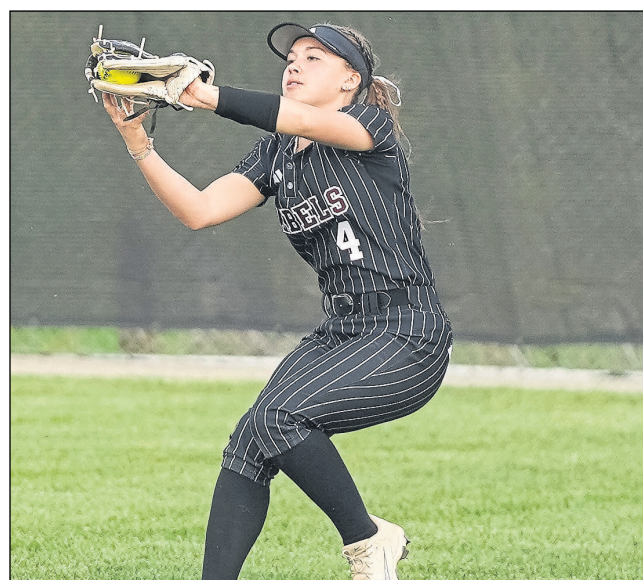

### KENTUCKY FREE FISHING WEEKEND IS JUNE 6-7

FRANKFORT — The Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources invites residents and visitors of all ages to take advantage of Kentucky's "Free Fishing Weekend," June 6-7. This annual event allows everyone to enjoy fishing in waters across the commonwealth without purchasing a fishing license or permit. All other regulations, including size limits and the number of fish an individual is permitted to keep, still apply. Permission is always needed if fishing in private waters. Communities all across Kentucky participate by offering fun special events for anglers, especially for youth. Check local listings or click on the Free Fishing Weekend webpage on the department's website (fw.ky.gov) to find many known events. For those new to fishing, Kentucky Fish and Wildlife provides various resources to get started on a lifetime of fishing enjoyment. A breakdown of those resources follows. Get the basics: The Learn to Fish webpage provides basic information on gear, where to go fishing, suggested lures and tackle, catching and cleaning a fish and a number of instructional videos from knot tying to filleting fish. For those

with more experience, visit the department's main Fishing landing page for links to all fishing topics. Get equipped: Fishing poles can be purchased inexpensively at sporting goods and box stores, second-hand stores and yard sales. Fishing poles can also be borrowed for free at a number of locations across the state. Search for nearby locations on the Loarer Fishing Pole Locations map on the department's website. Learn the rules: See the annual Kentucky Fishing & Boating Guide, also in a Spanish language version, for a complete summary of all fishing regulations.

Where to go: Visit the Fishing in Neighborhoods (FINs) webpage for lists of easily accessible, specially stocked lakes. For a comprehensive list of fishing and boating access sites across Kentucky, check out the Waterbodies Search webpage. Get inside information: Peruse the annual fishing forecast and tips webpage for insider information on fish around the state. Find fish: Search the Lakes with Fish Attractors webpage for habitat maps at various lakes and download GPX files from there. Continue learning: Kentucky Fish and Wildlife hosts Hook and Cook classes in a number of communities throughout the year. Look for one- and two-day classes to improve or learn new skills. For anglers on the go, download and use Kentucky's Fish Boat KY app. The app helps users to find directions to local lakes, read fishing reports, learn about regulations, find stocking schedules, locate the nearest boat ramp and more. The app is available in the iTunes and Google Play app stores. The water is calling. Pack up the family on the first weekend of June and enjoy fishing in Kentucky — for free.

HARRODSBURG — Owen County freshman Peyton Buchanan was among the players named to the All-8th Region Softball Tournament Team.

Buchanan is among the top high school softball players in the 8th Region. She is one of the 8th Region's best young high school student-athletes.

Owen County, Anderson County, Grant County, Henry County, Oldham County, Simon Kenton, South Oldham and Woodford County comprised the field for the 8th Region Softball Tournament. Anderson County defeated Owen County 17-3 in five innings during the quarterfinals of the 8th Region Softball Tournament at Mercer County on Sunday, May 24. Oldham County won the 8th

Region softball title. Repeating as champion, Oldham County doubled up rival South Oldham 8-4 in the 8th Region Softball Tournament title game.

Buchanan led Owen County in the 8th Region Softball Tournament, connecting for two of the Lady Rebels' five hits.

The productive Buchanan was among Owen County's leaders throughout the 2026 high school softball season. As a freshman, Buchanan batted .398 with 37 hits, 26 RBIs, 2 doubles and 1 triple. She scored 31 runs and recorded eight stolen bases.

After excelling in the postseason, Buchanan will be carrying momentum into her senior campaign. Buchanan and several of her Owen County teammates will be back on the field competing in the 2027 high school softball season.

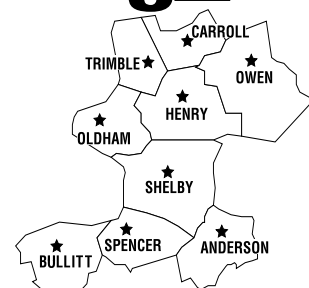
