Frederick Douglass. All of the scoring happened in the first three innings as the host team scored three times in the bottom of the first. It was 3-2 before the Lady Broncos scored twice in the third. The game had a weather delay and when the team returned to the field for the seventh Bullitt East got runners to second and third, but could not get the big hit to pull even as Frederick Douglass secured the 5-2 win.

Bullitt East had four errors in the game and those were costly. Watrous was the starter and worked the first three innings. The sophomore allowed three hits and all five of the runs, but only two were earned. Watrous walked three and had four strikeouts. Mingus pitched three innings, allowing four hits and no runs. At the plate, Bullitt East collected six hits. One of those hits was a home run by Watrous

while Cooper had a pair of doubles. Kylie Willis also had a double. Last week started with a game against Butler, a program that won the 2021 state championship, but is struggling this spring. That was starting to show last season when Bullitt East beat the Bearettes 15-0 in the Sixth Region semifinals. The outcome was not that different on Monday as Bullitt East won 13-2.

Mingus was the starting pitcher and was credited with the win as she worked three innings, allowing two hits and one earned run Watrous worked the final two innings and gave up two hits and one earned run.
