for that 6th District seat

with a total of 26,858 votes. Dembo also carried Madison County with 2,525 votes.

Incumbent State

Representative Deanna Frazier Gordon held onto her seat in the 81st District. Defeating challenger Andrew Simpson with

1,004 votes to his 490.

Frazier Gordon will go on to face Democrat Anthony Jordan Looney in the General Election.

Over in District 91, Darrell Billings won 2,881 votes — defeating Jeff Hensley to take over the seat held by incumbent

State Representative Billy Wesley.

Billings will now face Democrat David Johnson in the General Election.

Executive in Madison County.

Incumbent Jailer Larry Brock — who took over that role after Steve Tussey stepped down — was defeated by former Jailer Doug Thomas. Thomas received 4,782 votes to

Brock's 3,041. Jonathan Everett King came in third with 1,107 votes.

The races for the county's four Magistrate positions didn't see such strong victory margins. Incumbent Brian Combs held onto his seat by a little over 20 votes, bringing in 709 votes to runner up Terry Napier's 687 votes.

While 2nd District

Magistrate Stephen Lochmueller lost by a similar margin to Bruce Barnes. Barnes has 950 votes to Lochmueller's 927.

Down in the 4th District Magistrate race, Chris Sipple won out in a crowded field with 800 votes. A little over 100 more than Albert E. Winkler's 692. Billy Ray Hughes —

incumbent 3rd District Magistrate — had a strong performance. With 1,385 victories to challenger Jason Scott Rawlin's 618.

The strongest performance of the night came from District Court Judge Tyler Frazier, who brought in 10,199 votes to secure his incumbency as Judge of Kentucky's 25th District Court's 1st Division.

For District 3 Constable, Jonathan Fritz overtook James Ebert with 983 votes to 844.

District 4 Constable Jonathan Brock will keep his seat, bringing in 1,521 votes to Greg Mayo's 689.

around September or October of 2025, Whitehall Paraeducator Beverly Thompson-Vanwinkle was abusive and neglectful to the child. It also claims that she took video footage of the child and sent it to other

people.

On October 15, Thompson-Vanwinkle allegedly struck and pulled the hair of the child while Teacher Harold Prewitt recorded the incident and sent out the video.

Teacher Deanna Barton is also named in the lawsuit, with it alleging that she was also abusive to the child

in this timeframe and also sprayed her with a water bottle on multiple occasions.

The lawsuit indicates that the child's disability prevented her from telling anyone about the alleged abuse.

The child's parents — under the pseudonyms of Arthur and Kelli Doe — are seeking judgement against the School Board and those

employees in the lawsuit for both compensatory and punitive damages, their costs, and any relief their daughter is entitled to.

The School District's online staff directory still lists Beverly Thompson-VanWinkle, Deanna Barton, and Harold Prewitt as employees of White Hall Elementary.

records and testimony, on Feb. 22, 2022, Gilday broke into the home of Wesley Morgan and opened fire with an AR-15, killing Jordan. Morgan's wife and managed to flee the scene. Wesley Morgan allegedly exchanged gunfire with Gilday and was

wounded in the process.

Investigators with the Kentucky State Police claim that Gilday was convinced that nuclear war was imminent. and that he targeted the Morgan Residence for a multi-million dollar bunker located inside of the home.

"He told me he was willing to kill everyone inside the residence if necessary in order to

access the bunker," said Detective Camron Allen of the Kentucky State Police during a March 2022 pre-trial hearing.

Investigators also say Gilday had unsuccessfully attempted to break into the bunker inside the Morgan residence once before by using a tunnel.

It was also claimed that he had scouted out the property on multiple occa-

sions before the invasion.
