which involved a side-by-side utility vehicle.

Investigators reported that the side-by-side was traveling southbound on US 25 when it crossed the centerline, ran off the roadway, struck a culvert and overturned.

Authorities said the crash resulted in fatal injuries to the driver, who was the only occupant of the vehicle.

The driver was identified as Dennis Johnson III, 19,

of London, who was pronounced deceased at the scene by staff with the Laurel County Coroner's Office.

Several agencies assisted deputies at the scene, includ-

ing East Bernstadt Fire and Rescue, Ambulance Inc. of Laurel County, the London-Laurel County Rescue Squad, Laurel County Department of Public Safety, and the Laurel

County Coroner's Office.

The funeral service for Johnson will be conducted Saturday afternoon in the Bowling Funeral Home Chapel.

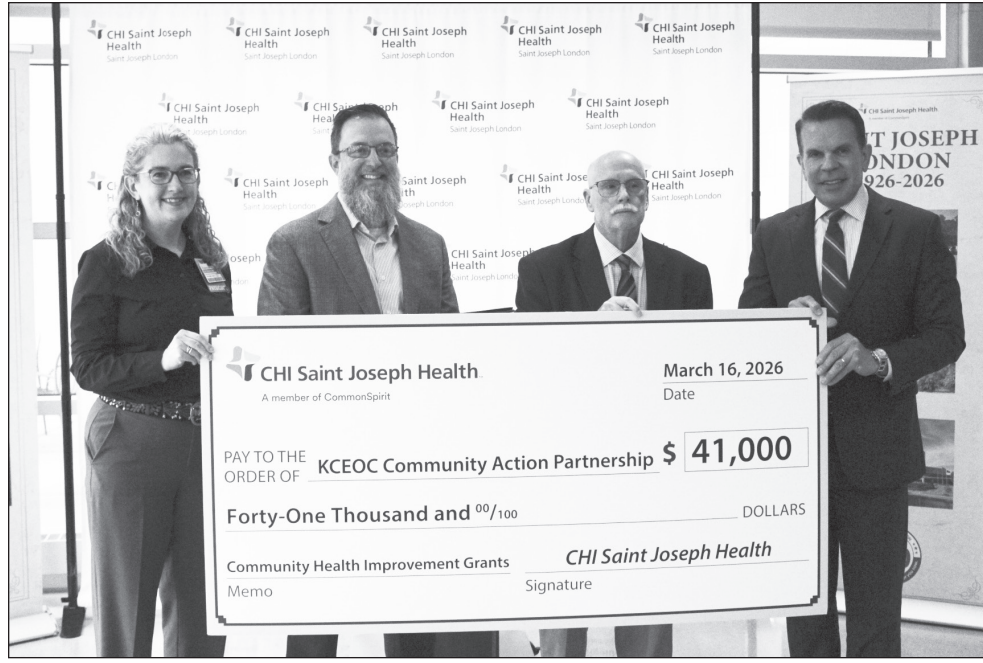
working to address key health priorities such as substance use disorders, mental health challenges, nutrition, physical activity, and other social factors impacting community health.

"At Saint Joseph Health, we are committed to a healthier future for all and addressing the unique needs of our neighbors," Yanes said. "As a member of CommonSpirit Health, we seek to continuously advance the common good. Our mission calls out a special focus on serving the vulnerable, and the work of these incredible organizations is essential in advancing well-being and health equity across the area."

Two organizations serving the region received funding through the program.

KCEOC Community Action Partnership Inc. received \$41,000 to support physical education programming within Knox County Public Schools. The funding will provide educational materials and equipment designed to help improve the overall physical fitness of students.

"We are really appreciative of CHI Saint Joseph Health for this investment in our students and families," said Knox County Public Schools Superintendent Jer-

Ledford added that the initiative will also encourage healthy habits beyond the classroom.

"The Family Fitness Nights will strengthen healthy habits at home for students and their families across the Knox County Public Schools. We appreciate the spirit Saint Joseph Health embodies, as it helps make Knox County a healthier community," Ledford said.

Miles Estes, special projects director for KCEOC, also expressed appreciation for the partnership.

"The school system has utilized the funding to access resources for mental health and food insecurity," said Estes. "So with this, we'll have addressed three areas of (a) child's wellbeing — physical, emotional and nutrition."

Hospice of the Bluegrass Inc. received \$97,500 to expand access to care for high-risk patients in Laurel, Jackson and Whitley counties. The funding will support a partnership with Bluegrass Transitional Care to provide care for up to 181 patients through a 30-day bundled care program.

The program includes hospital bedside enrollment, three in-home nurse visits, and unlimited 24/7 phone support for patients and families following discharge.

"This grant strengthens our ability to serve individuals and families across our community with the care, comfort, and support they deserve," said Liz Fowler, president of Bluegrass Care Navigators. "It reflects the power of partnership in ensuring no one has to face serious illness alone."
