Westbound I-64 entrance ramp to close for improvements

Beginning Wednesday night, June 3, the westbound entrance ramp from Georgetown Road (KY 341) to westbound I-64 in Midway

will be closed while road crews perform pavement reconstruction operations, according to a news release from the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, District 7.

The closure is anticipated to stay in place for approximately 20 days, but the ramp may reopen sooner as work progresses, the release stated.

Motorists are advised to reduce speed and use extra caution while traveling through the work zone. All work and/or closures are scheduled on a tentative basis and are subject to change depending on weather, emergencies and other factors beyond the highway department's control, the release stated.

Ongoing improvements on I-64 in Woodford, Scott and Fayette counties, including ramp upgrades at the Midway exit, are part of a \$14 million construction project, according to Brooklynn McIntosh of the state Department of Highways District 7. In an April 28 email to the Sun, she wrote that road improvements include new blacktop, as well as bridge and drainage repairs to "provide Kentuckians a safer, smoother ride."

Improvements along nearly seven miles of I-64 between Midway and the I-64/I-75 northern split "will continue through the summer and fall and is scheduled for completion by Nov. 1," she said.
