Summary of Ordinance No. 8, 2026:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2-2026, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RUSSELL, KENTUCKY, RELATIVE TO PUBLIC NUISANCES

The City enacted Ordinance No. 2-2026, establishing standards for defining public nuisances, assessment of civil fines and charges for public nuisances, establishing the Property Maintenance Code Enforcement Board and procedures for enforcement and abatement of public nuisances and assessment of abatement costs against properties and property owners for violations. This ordinance amends Ordinance No. 2-2026 only to modify the definitions section of the ordinance for what constitutes a public nuisance. This ordinance amends Ordinance No. 2-2026 only to remove holiday/seasonal yard decorations and playground equipment in front yards from the definition of public nuisance under the Ordinance. All remaining provisions of Ordinance 2-2026 remain in effect and are not affected by this ordinance.

The City of Wurtland, Kentucky, will receive sealed bids for the CCBIP Bridge Joint Repair Project until 5 p.m. EST (4 p.m. CST) on September 17th, 2026, at 500 Wurtland Ave, Wurtland, KY 41144, at which time and place all bids will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The project generally consists of furnishing all labor, materials, equipment, supervision, bridge closure, traffic control, railroad coordination, and incidentals necessary to replace the existing bridge joint seals and armored joint assemblies on the Wurts Road bridge over the railroad in Wurtland, Kentucky. Bids shall be submitted on a lump sum basis.

The Contractor shall be solely responsible for coordinating all work with the railroad, including obtaining any required permits, approvals, flagging services, insurance, and scheduling. All costs associated with railroad coordination shall be included in the bid.

The Contractor shall also be responsible for providing and maintaining all required traffic control necessary to safely perform the work in accordance with applicable federal, state, and local requirements.

ORDINANCE NO. 5-2026

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BELLEFONTE, KENTUCKY FIXING THE TAX RATE FOR THE CITY OF BELLEFONTE, KENTUCKY FOR THE TAX YEAR 2026 CONCERNING MOTOR VEHICLES AND WATER-CRAFTS; ESTABLISHING SAID TAX RATE AT .28 FOR EACH \$100.00 OF TAXABLE PROPERTY; AND OTHER MATTERS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Bellefonte, Kentucky, in compliance with the Kentucky Revised Statute and other applicable law has determined the tax rate for the taxable year 2021:P

NOW BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Bellefonte, Kentucky, as follows:

SECTION 1: That there is hereby levied an ad valorem tax on all motor vehicles and watercraft, within the City of Bellefonte, Kentucky, subject to taxation for general revenue purposes of .28 per \$100.00 of taxable property for the tax year 2026.

SECTION 2: This Ordinance and the rate set herein is contemplated to and does comply with all provisions of Kentucky Revised Statutes, Chapter 132 and all other applicable law.

SECTION 3: All Ordinances in conflict herewith are specifically hereby repealed to the extent of said conflict only.

SECTION 4: That each section and each sentence of this Ordinance is enacted separately, and the invalidity and/or unconstitutionality of any one particular sentence and/or section shall not affect the validity and/or constitutionality of any other sentence and/or section.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance shall be given full force and effect and become effective at either its date of publication or such effective date as is stated within the body of the Ordinance.
