Legislative Update

Senator Robin L. Webb

The next few weeks are shaping up to be a busy time for the Kentucky General Assembly, as a wide range of policy issues will soon come to the forefront. From juvenile justice reforms to changes in the state income tax, there will be no shortage of complex issues we will deliberate on. I understand these policy decisions play a significant role in the lives of constituents and across the entire commonwealth, and I take that responsibility very seriously.

I want to assure my constituents that I am fully committed to delving into these issues and ensuring the voices of our community are heard in the process. I will carefully review each proposal and work across the aisle to find solutions that benefit the greatest number of Kentuckians while also protecting the rights and interests of those who may be affected. I encourage my constituents to reach out to me with their thoughts, concerns, and ideas as we work on these critical issues in the coming weeks.

On Wednesday, Governor Andy Beshear held an event in Louisville to tout his Education First Plan, which he presented to the General Assembly in his State of the Commonwealth Address earlier this month. He listed several main topics he would like the legislature to address. The most notable elements of the Governor's plan include a five percent pay raise for teachers and school staff and funding universal pre-K.

I firmly believe that Kentucky teachers go above and beyond in their efforts to educate our children and shape the future of our state. They often work long hours, in and out of the classroom, to ensure that students have the best possible learning experience. Our educa-

tors also consistently demonstrate their dedication and commitment despite facing numerous challenges, such as limited resources, changing curriculum standards, and increasing class sizes.

Our teachers play a vital role in the development of society and our future economic viability. They have the task of preparing students to be productive and responsible citizens, and they play a significant role in ensuring that our workforce is well-educated and skilled. Given all of these factors, I believe our teachers deserve a raise. This would acknowledge their hard work and dedication while also helping attract and retain the best and brightest in our state. Investing in our teachers is investing in our future.

Another major theme of the Education First Plan is the funding of universal pre-K. Universal pre-K programs significantly impact education outcomes, with research invariably demonstrating that children participating in high-quality pre-K programs are more likely to be successful. One of the benefits of universal pre-K is that it can help close the achievement gap between children from low-income families and their more affluent peers. Children from low-income families are disproportionately likely to lack access to high-quality early childhood education, which puts them at a disadvantage when they begin school. Universal pre-K programs can level the playing field by providing all children with access to the same high-quality education and care.

Other aspects of the Education First Plan include restoring funding for textbooks and professional development, launching loan forgiveness, supporting

mental health, and reintegrating pensions. However the General Assembly chooses to proceed on these matters, we must be diligent. It is evident that our education system requires reforms and improvements.

I understand the Governor's recommendations and support some of his proposals. However, I also want to ensure that any changes we make are well-researched and thoughtfully considered. I am open to evaluating the Governor's recommendations and other alternative proposals so long as they reflect an education system that is adequately funded and provides students, teachers, and support staff the tools they need to succeed.

We must work together and address the challenges facing our education system. I believe that by working together, we can find a solution that benefits our students, educators, and communities without making these issues political. I am fully committed to being a part of the process, and I look forward to exchanging ideas with my colleagues.
