

Michael J. Kunick, 46, of McDaniels, was charged with two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, 1st degree, a Class C felony; and possession of a handgun by a convicted felon, a Class C felony. On or about March 4, 2024. Kunick allegedly, while acting alone or in complicity with another, knowunlawfully and possessed a controlled substance with the intent to distribute, dispense, sell or transfer said controlled substance to another, to wit: fentanyl, two grams or more, code 42590; knowingly and unlawfully possessed a controlled substance with the intent to distribute, dispense, sell or transfer said controlled substance to another, to wit: methamphetamine, grams or more, code 42365; and was found in possession of a 9mm Smith and Wesson M&P after having been pre-

viously convicted of a felony. Austin Goine, 42, of Millersburg, was charged with two counts of trafficking in a controlled substance, 1st degree, a Class C felony; possession of a handgun by a convicted felon, a class C felony; and possession of a controlled substance, 1st degree, a class D felony. On or about March 4, 2024, Goine allegedly, while acting alone or in complicity with another, knowingly and unlawfully possessed a controlled substance, with the intent to distribute, dispense, sell or transfer said controlled substance to another, to wit: fentanyl, two grams or more. Code 42590; knowingly and

unlawfully possessed a con-

tent to distribute, dispense, sell or transfer said controlled substance to another, to wit: methamphetamine, grams or more. Code 42365; was found in possession of a 9mm Smith and Wesson M&P after having been previously convicted of a felony; and knowingly and unlawfully possessed Xanax, a con-

trolled substance. Ricky Dale Flinders, 41, of Tollesboro, was charged with wanton endangerment, 1st degree, a class D felony; wanton endangerment, 1st physical evidence, a class D felony; possession of a controlled substance, 2nd degree, a class A misdemeanor; possession of marijuana, a class misdemeanor; giving peace officer false name or address, a class B misdemeanor; possession of drug paraphernalia, a class A misdemeanor; and operating veunder intoxicants. On or about October 21, 2023, Flinders allegedly, while acting alone or in complicity with another, unlawfully exposed another to fentanyl, thereby creating a substantial danger of death or serious physical injury to her; exposed another to fentanyl, thereby creating a substantial danger of death or serious physical injury to him; destroyed, mutilated, concealed, removed and/or altered physical evidence, which he believed was about to be produced or used in an official proceeding, with the intent to impair its verity or

unlawfully

On or about February 12, 2024, Aldridge allegedly, while acting alone or in complicity of another, knowingly and unlawfully possessed a controlled substance, with the intent to distribute, dispense, sell or transfer said controlled substance to another, to wit: methamphetamine, grams or more. Code 42365; destroyed, mutilated, concealed, removed and/or altered physical evidence, which he believed was about to be produced or used in an official proceeding, with the intent to impair its verity or availability; and knowingly and unlawfully possessed items intended for introducing into the human body a controlled substance.
