## **80 YEARS AGO**

April 12, 1945 In a meeting at the Lawrenceburg Courthouse Tuesday night, plans were made for the United National clothing collection. the local organization led by judge W.S. Johnson as County chairman, elected by Miss Ann Dowling as secretary; Ben Bond, transportation; Goebel Brossfield, location chairman: etc. The United National clothing collection is a united effort on the part of United Nations relief and Rehabilitation and various voluntary War relief agencies of the United States. The drive is to run the entire month of April with the goal of 150,000,000 pounds of clothing. Throughout War torn areas clothing is very scarce and worn out. more than 125,000,000 people are in liberated nations of Europe which are in dire need of clothing. Of these more than 30,000,000 are children. Because of the demand of armed forces and civilian needs, manufacture of clothing in the United States or other countries to relieve those distressed people will not get underway for some time. This means needy men, women, and children in war devastated countries must depend on the help

of the American people. A checkup with the local Red Cross office reveals that the goal set for Anderson County

is below its Mark with \$950 yet to be raised. To date, \$8,350 has been given, Yet the \$9,300 is urgently needed to carry on the great work of the American Red cross. The organization is facing the greatest

task in its history and serving American fighting men on advancing warfronts overseas, their families at home, and the American people on the Homefront. all over the world American

boys are fighting. The great armies of the world are made up of men who come from all the countries of the world. To keep this Army functioning on the Foreign Fields and on the home front, the time, the energy, and the dollars of the American people are needed.

### **60 YEARS AGO April 8, 1965**

A distracting plan was adopted by the Anderson County School Board Monday night at its regularly monthly meeting and will be put into effect for the 1965 to 1966 year. It will result in the interrogation of Elementary pupils next September. Superintendent Andrew Bird said the board's action came after the state department advised that their plans for compliance with the 1964 Civil Rights Act would probably not get Federal approval. Anderson County began in 1956 to open Anderson County High School to African American students who choose to attend rather than attend Lincoln institute, the state's all African American High School for students because school districts did not have schools for them. The board voted unanimously to require pupils to attend the school in the district where they live or pay \$45 a year in tuition, superintendent Bird said.

The city council approved an ordinance authorizing the city to participate in the **County Employees** Retirement System at its regular monthly meeting Monday night. The ordinance is to become effective July 1, of this year. The ordinance States that all eligible, regular full-time officers and employees of the city are directed to comply with the statutory requirements of the system. City attorney Walter Patrick told the council that the Ashland Oil Company had recently purchased Mabel Williams and Virginia Johnson's property between the A&P Co. and Bush Ave on South Main St. here. Ashland Oil and A&P would like for the city to close the alley so the two firms can widen it and use it as a common entrance to both properties. They said Council authorized

the attorney to take the necessary steps to close the alley if the two property owners will bear the expense of the legal action necessary to affect its closing. Billy Shields appeared before the council and said his franchise to handle garbage pickup and disposal in the city expires June 30th of this year. He asked that when the city takes this matter up, he would like for them to delete the paragraph that lists the rates that might be charged for collections. he said he's not asking for a rate increase but that on several occasions situations have arisen that the ordinance does not fit as the rates were set many years ago and in some cases were a business or industrial client has had a very large volume or special handling is required the rates are not realistic according

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
