McCane stated they can clarify that as it is in their development drawings. Bird requested a revision be put in the proposal that lighting will comply with the ordinance.

Callam asked attorney Edward Logan about greater public interest to which he replied he hasn't heard any testimony that establishes the greater public interest

He also asked if anyone had reached out to the Distillers Association, to which Logan replied that they have not nor would they as this meeting was a public notice. He had not heard any concerns from that organization.

Callam added that he would ask them all to anticipate where people would stand on this issue had they had full knowledge and not be so busy as it always is for everyone to come to these meetings and express themselves. He added that in a perfect world, all the surrounding residents would be at the meeting and he strongly proposed that 90 percent of those and he lives close to there

residents would be in opposition.

Planning administrator Renee Evans responded that in February of last year the planning commission decided they would do courtesy notices to give people an idea of what's going on and they over extend and do the courtesy notices to adjacent property owners as well as put in on Facebook and in The Anderson News although it is not required to try and make sure everyone sees something.

Official notices must be sent to adjacent in this particular situation. (surrounding) property owners and to run notices in The Anderson News, which is the legal publication.

Carter made a motion to approve, stating he agreed with a lot of what was said by those opposed as he was raised on Bonds Mill Road now and technically they have to go by the rules and if it complies with the regulations as this does. However, he made the motion contingent on the lighting and that it does not affect the surrounding

The motion passed with three in favor, one in opposition, and two abstained.

The second item on the agenda was a request made by owners Chris and Melissa Hanks for the approval of the final plat of The Reserve at Highland Pointe.

The property owners are asking to develop six lots in the R-2 Residential zone. The property is located on the east side of Highland Avenue approximately .24 miles south of the intersection on Highway 62 and Highland Avenue' The tract is 2.35 acres.

Evans stated this went through technical review on March 25, and she had to go back and do a prereview as there were a few things missing from the staff report, including the fact that the cul-de-sac is over 500 feet long. Evans stated the applicant needs to request a waiver for approval for that. She added there are a few corrections that also need to be made to the plat.

Evans recommended this plat be tabled until they can come back and request a waiver for the length of the cul-de-sac and make the corrections on the plat.
