Adjacent property owners received a letter dated July 20, informing them that Hannah Joyce Yeager Carlton of 1288 Harrodsburg Road was requesting a tract of land containing 42.67 acres to be rezoned from its present zoning classification of A-1 (agricultural district) to a new zoning classification of R-2 (two-family residential district). The property, located at the intersection of Melanie Dr. and Melanie Ct., already has been annexed into the city.
