ior disability, hearing impairment, mental disability, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairment, specific learning disability, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, or visual impairment and who because of such an impairment need Special Education services. Children eligible for 504 services include those children in a public ele-

mental impairment that currently substantially limits some major life activity which causes the student's ability to access the school environment or school activities to be substantially limited. Children eligible for the State-Funded Preschool program include threeand four-year-old children identified with disabilities and four-year-old children who are at-risk, as defined by federal poverty levels up to 150%.

Distribute any matter depicting another person engaged in sexual conduct or in a state of nudity or seminudity with the intent to coerce that person to: 1.Engage in sexual conduct; 2.Produce, provide, or distribute any matter depicting that person engaging in sexual conduct or in a state of nudity Provide the payment of money, property, services, or any other thing of value to the perpetrator; or 4.Do any act or refrain from do ing any act against his or her will.

Used or threatened the use of a deadly weapon or dangerous instrument against the victim during the commission of the offense; or d. Is an adult and the victim is a minor, and there is greater than a four (4) year difference in age between them; or The offense was committed during the course of a kidnapping as
