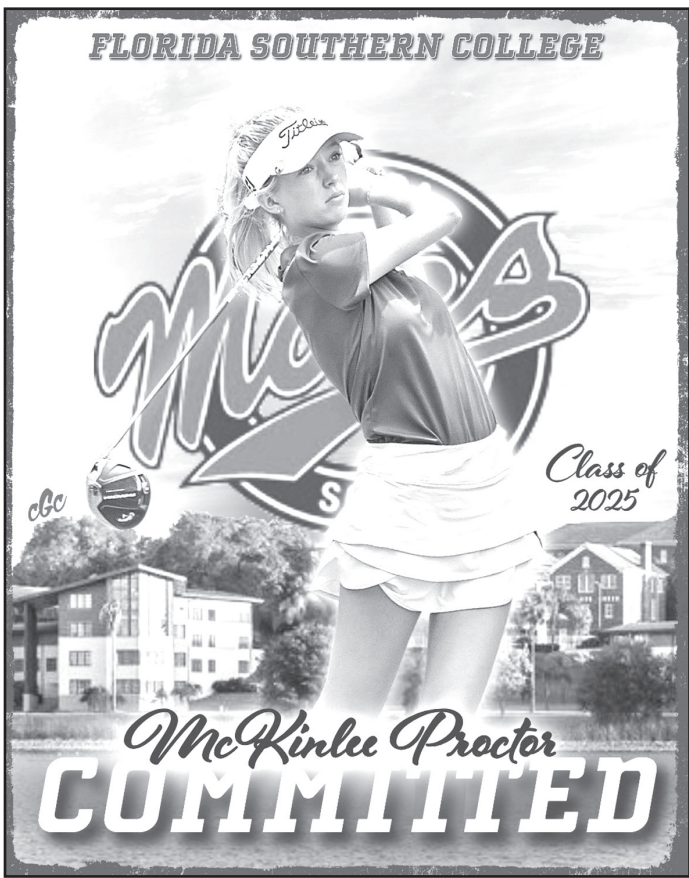

Daughter Of Fmr. Elliott Co. Resident Is Georgia State High School Golf Champion



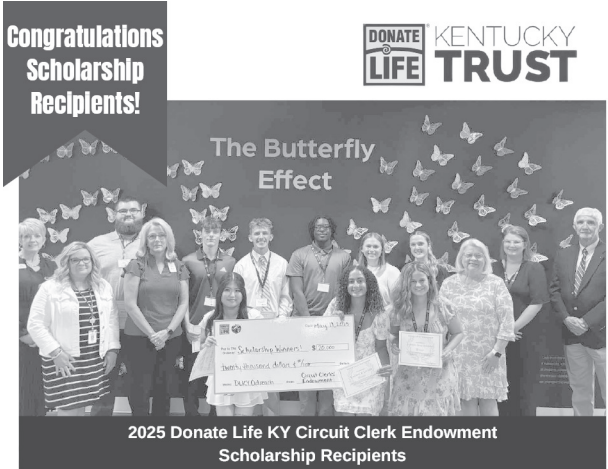
McKinlee Proctor
