TREND ANALYSIS As the winter season winds down, gas prices dropped by five cents over the past week, bringing the national average to \$3.09 per gallon. Today's national average for a gallon of gas is flat compared to a month ago and 25 cents less than a year

According to new data from the **Energy Information Administration** (EIA), gasoline demand increased from 8.23 million barrels per day last week to 8.45. Total domestic gasoline supply increased from 247.9

million barrels to 248.3, while gasoline production decreased last week, averaging 9.2 million barrels per

At the close of last Wednesday's formal trading session. West Texas Intermediate dropped \$0.31 to settle at \$68.62 a barrel. The EIA reports that crude oil inventories decreased by 2.3 million barrels from the previous week. At 430.2 million barrels, U.S. crude oil inventories are about 4% below the five-year average for this time of year.
