The Rating Score of the establishment is determined by subtracting weighted point values of noted violations from 100. Unannounced inspections observe the overall operation including food source and protection; personnel; food equipment & utensils; maintenance of water and sewage systems; garbage and refuse disposal; insect, rodent and animal control; and storage of toxic items, among others. Critical violations are items which, if uncorrected, carry the potential to be an imminent threat to the public's health. These items must be corrected in a time designated by the health department not to exceed 10 days.

Hodgenville restaurant tax begins **BY VICTORIA COX** PAXTON MEDIA GROUP

Consumers purchasing ready-to-eat food within Hodgenville will begin paying an additional 3% restaurant tax starting July 1.

The tax applies to any commercial establishment that prepares and serves ready-toeat foods sold within city limits.

The new tax is the result of the Hodgenville City Council's April decision to tax all retail sales of restaurants doing business within city limits. The revenue is required by state law to be used to support the Hodgenville Tourism & Convention Commission and its efforts to promote tourism.

The city will receive 5% of all tax collections as reimbursement for the cost of collections.

The commission is required to use the money for projects and undertakings that promote and develop recreational, convention and tourist activity within the city.

A written report of all income and expenditures must be provided to the city council monthly. According to Hodgenville Mayor Jim Phelps, the first report is due Aug. 30.
