

RESTAURANT INSPECTIONS

The Rating Score of the establishment is determined by subtracting weighted point values of noted violations from 100. Unannounced inspections observe the overall operation including food source and protection; personnel; food equipment & utensils; maintenance of water and sewage systems; garbage and refuse disposal; insect, rodent and animal control; and storage of toxic items, among others. Critical violations are items which, if uncorrected, carry the potential to be an imminent threat to the public's health. These items must be corrected in a time designated by the health department not to exceed 10 days.

Hodgenville restaurant tax begins

Consumers purchasing ready-to-eat food within Hodgenville will begin paying an additional 3% restaurant tax starting July 1.

The tax applies to any commercial establishment that prepares and serves ready-to-eat foods sold within city limits.

The new tax is the result of the Hodgenville City Council's April decision to tax all retail sales of restaurants doing business within city limits. The revenue is required by state law to be used to support the Hodgenville Tourism & Convention Commission and its efforts to promote tourism.

The city will receive 5% of all tax collections as reimbursement for the cost of collections.

The commission is required to use the money for projects and undertakings that promote and develop recreational, convention and tourist activity within the city.

A written report of all income and expenditures must be provided to the city council monthly. According to Hodgenville Mayor Jim Phelps, the first report is due Aug. 30.

SUMMARY OF AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO COMPENSATION OF CODE ENFORCEMENT BOARD

WHEREAS, the City of Leitchfield may exercise its power in furtherance of public policy purposes; **WHEREAS**, the City has the power to set reasonable compensation to those who are appointed to serve on boards for the City of Leitchfield; and **NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the City of Leitchfield, Kentucky that Amended Ordinance 2023-02 passed on the 2Q1h day of February, 2023 shall be amended as follows with added portions being underlined and deleted portions being indicated by a line drawn through them and encompassed by brackets enclosing them:

SECTION 4. Appointment of members; term of office; removal from office; oath; compensation.
(h) Members of the code enforcement board shall be reimbursed for actual expenses shown by proof and compensated in the amount of one-hundred (\$ 100) dollars [fifty dollars]per month. The chairman of the board shall be compensated an additional fifty dollars (\$50) per month for their service as chair of the board. These i ncreases shall be effective July 1. 2025. Duly enacted on the 16th day of June, 2025 after first being read on the 2nd day of June, 2025

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF LEITCHFIELD, KENTUCKY ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2024, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2025, BY ESTIMATING REVENUES AND RESOURCES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF CITY GOVERNMENT

WHEREAS, The City of Leitchfield, Kentucky has heretofore adopted its budget for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, by ordinance enacted January 21, 2025 and

WHEREAS it is necessary to amend the said budget ordinance in order to more accurately reflect the revenues and expenditures of the City of Leitchfield, Kentucky in certain budget categories,
