vised Statutes to annually, by ordinance, provide for the assess ment of all property located within the corporate limits of the City and levy an ad valorem tax thereon, to choose a method of as-sessing property of the City, and to collect the City's taxes; and WHEREAS, the property assessment has been certified as:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF CLARKSON, KENTUCKY There is levied for 2025 an ad valorem tax of:

8.900 Cents per \$100 Assessed Valuation on Real Estate 29.060 Cents per \$100 Assessed Valuation on Tangible Personal Property

There is levied for 2026 a tax of: 10.000 Cents per \$100 Assessed Valuation on Vehicle &

The City elects to use the County assessment prepared by the Grayson County Property Valuation Administrator (PVA) Taxes, other than vehicle and watercraft (which are collected by

the Grayson County Court Clerk), will be independently collected by the City of Clarkson. Tax shall be due and payable on or before November 30, 2025. Tax paid on or before November 30 2025 will be subject to a 2% discount. Tax paid after November 30, 2025 or by December 31, 2025 will pay full amount of tax due. Tax paid after December 31, 2025 or by January 31, 2026 will be assessed a 5% penalty.
