The Blankenship Twins

Twin girls, Cora Hester and Dora Esther, were born January8,1888.Atthetime of their birth, chances of their survival, even their existence, were meager. Remarkably, they defied the odds against them.

Twins were not common in the 1800s. with a birth rate estimated to be around 9 twins per 1,000 births. That was significantly lower than the modern rate of 32.1 twins per 1,000 births.

Once born, twins also had to content with the United States infant mortality rate which was 46.3%, meaning that almost half of all children born did not survive to the age of five. Their deaths came from a wide range of causes.

Despite these daunting statistics, Cora and Dora came into this world, where they survived and thrived.

Their parents were William Michael "Billy Mike" Blankenship and Emily Susan Hartfield Blankenship, of the Fry community. The couple already had six children: Elnorah Ellen b. 1874, Susan E. "Susie" b. 1876, John Isaac b. 1878, James Robert "Jim" b. 1880, Mary "Mollie" b. 1883, and Emma Lee b. 1886.

When Cora and Dora were 2 years old, their mother gave birth to another set of twins, William Thomas and Leathe. They were born October 21, 1890. Sadly, neither infant lived to their first birthday.

Another son, Thomas G., was born one June 8, 1892. He reached his second birthday but died about a month later.

A third set of twins was born to Billy Mike and Emily Blankenship around 1895. No record of Leon and Leo's births or

deaths exists today, but family oral history says the boys were severely injured when a runaway team of horses and wagon ran over them. The accident led to their death around the age of 9 or 10.

The youngest Blankenship child, Effie Myrtle "Doll," was born in 1899. Her nickname came from her tiny size, only weighing a few pounds at birth.

By 1906, Billy Mike and Emily had lost five of their 14 children, including two sets of twins. The deaths must have been agonizing for the family. Fortunately, nine of their children grew up and started lives of their own. Their twin girls, Cora and Dora, grew into lovely young ladies.

Coramarried Montford Davenport "Montie" Sullivan on February 2, 1910 and had six children: Royce Taft, Alice Victoria, Isaac William "Ike," Omar Homar, Mary Elizabeth, and Fanny Alliene Sullivan.

Dora went by the

nickname "Dick" most of her life. She married Hansel Ulysses "Hanse" Buchanan on December 29, 1911. They went on to have ten children together: William Berry, James Leslie, John Wesley, Gracie Lee, Robert Austin, Frank Hardin, Oscar Ray, Twyman "Buck," Alva Royce, and Arthur D. Buchanan.

Cora passed away at the age of 62 on September 15, 1950. Her death came just weeks after her husband's. They were both buried in the cemetery at Bethlehem Baptist Church.

Dora died on August 31, 1967 at the age of 79. She had been a widow since 1945. She and her husband were buried in the Buchanan Cemetery.

Born during a time when twins were a rarity and survival rates for infants were alarmingly low, these two sisters defied the odds from the very start. Today, their numerous descendants can be thankful for their strength and tenacity.
