out what happens when  
we lose these services.  
Let's raise our voices  
before it's too late.

Our neighbors de-  
pend on Audubon Area.  
Audubon Area depends  
on CSBG. And CSBG  
depends on leaders  
who believe in oppor-  
tunity for all.

Kentucky's commu-  
nities, government  
partners, and offi-  
cials must act now to  
preserve programs  
supporting our most  
vulnerable residents  
before it's too late!

## Opinion: Don't Let Washington Forget Communities Like Ours

What would our  
community look like  
without Audubon Area  
Community Services?

It's not a rhetorical  
question. It's a future  
we can't afford.

For 50 years, Audu-  
bon Area Community  
Services has quietly  
supported families in  
northwestern Ken-  
tucky through job  
training, housing as-  
sistance, healthcare  
access, and early ed-  
ucation. Every day,  
we help our neighbors  
navigate challenges  
that many in Wash-  
ington only see on  
spreadsheets: poverty,  
job loss, rising costs,  
and housing instabili-  
ty. We don't do it with  
bureaucracy, we do it  
with compassion, local  
knowledge, and proven  
results.

At the heart of our  
work is the Community  
Services Block Grant  
(CSBG)—a small but  
mighty federal pro-  
gram that helps more  
than 10 million Amer-  
icans every year. With  
just \$770 million in  
federal support, CSBG  
enables over 1,000 lo-  
cal agencies like Audu-



bun to tailor services to  
community needs. For  
every dollar we receive,  
we leverage nearly  
four more from local  
and private sources,  
all while keeping over-  
head costs low. That's  
not just efficient, it's  
transformational.

But today, these life-  
lines are under threat.

The White House's  
proposed FY2026 bud-  
get eliminates CSBG  
and significantly re-  
duces funding for the  
Low-Income Home  
Energy Assistance  
Program (LIHEAP),  
which helps families  
keep the heat on in  
winter and the lights  
on in summer. That's  
\$4.025 billion in re-  
sources stripped away  
from communities like

ours. Given inflation  
and ongoing challenges  
in meeting basic needs,  
these decisions would  
be devastating for fam-  
ilies and communities.

These aren't just  
budget decisions. They  
are value statements.

When funding dis-  
appears, programs  
vanish. And when pro-  
grams vanish, families  
suffer. At Audubon,  
that means real people  
lose real support:

A mother can't afford  
childcare or job train-  
ing.

A senior loses access  
to safe transportation.

A man on the path to  
recovery has nowhere  
to turn.

Our services aren't  
abstract—they're life-  
lines.

Through CSBG and  
partner programs,  
Audubon Area offers:

- Emergency food,  
housing, and energy  
assistance
- Job readiness  
through Kentucky  
Works, SNAP Em-  
ployment & Train-  
ing, and Senior Em-  
ployment Programs
- Healthcare access  
via the Audubon  
Community Care  
Clinic, serving over  
1,600 patients a  
year
- Recovery sup-  
port for more than  
250 men annually  
through Owensboro
