I think it will be a really nice opportunity for me to try and help out. Rob coached me during high school, and I grew up with Wayne's grandson; We graduated together and played baseball together our entire lives... Rob and I have been very close ever since he coached me. He told me that he felt like I'd be a good fit, based on my finance experience, and because we're so close

he knows how I am." Tyler graduated from Brescia University in 2020 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Finance and Economics. He is currently employed as an accountant at Commonwealth Rolled Products.

"I grew up here. I just bought a house in Hawesville. I plan on staying here for a long time," he said. "I'll plan on trying to be re-elected, and being here for the long haul. It would be a good way to
